Penn State plans for new facility

Plans for a new gymnasium-multi-purpose facility at Penn State Wilkes-Barre moved closer to reality recently with the announcement that the money for the \$3.7 million center has been released from the Pennsylvania Department of General Services and bids on the project will be opened December 7. This clears the way for construction to begin in early spring.

Dr. James H. Ryan, campus executive officer, made the announcement to the campus Advisory Board at a special dinner meeting.

The 34,066 square foot building will include a large basketball court with folding bleachers, racquetball courts, an aerobics-multi-purpose room, a fitness/wellness center, locker rooms, classrooms and staff/ faculty offices. The building is expected to be open to the public and for classes in the Fall of 1990.

to say that we will see construction begin on our new wellness/fitness center within the next five months," Ryan announced. "It will be a welcomed addition for the Back Mountain, a facility that will be open to the community as well as students. staff, faculty and alumni. Not onlywill we hold sporting events and physical education classes there, but it will be available for community activities."

"We are pleased that the state recognized the needs of its campus and region and was willing to provide the total funding for the facility," said John N. Conyngham, III, chairman of the Advisory Board. "We wholeheartedly thank area legislators for their support and guidance in getting the project underway.

"I am extremely pleased to be able fitness diagnostic center, Ryan stated. A national search is underway for an exercise physiologist who will be able to conduct physical/ wellness evaluations for the community, and prescribe personal fitness plans as well as teach and work with students.

> "As soon as we have the building under construction, we will be able to move into phase two of the plans which call for the addition of a pool, which will also be a welcomed community facility," Ryan said.

Architects for the project, Wallace and Watson Associates of Allentown, designed the structure so that a pool can be easily added.

"We are excited about bringing these health-related resources to the region as we move into an era where we are all more sensitive to the benefits of nutrition and proper exercise as the best preventative medicines," Ryan said.
