ermen that there are no safe ice conditions reported in the Commonwealth to date. A mild winter and insulting snows have left lakes with nothing more than "skim" ice, not safe for angling purposes.

The Commission favors four inches of clear, solid ice for fishing purposes, more if groups of anglers are fishing in one given area. The Commission warns, however, that this is a rule of thumb and not ever a certainty.
