### Dallas Boy Scouts visit elected officials

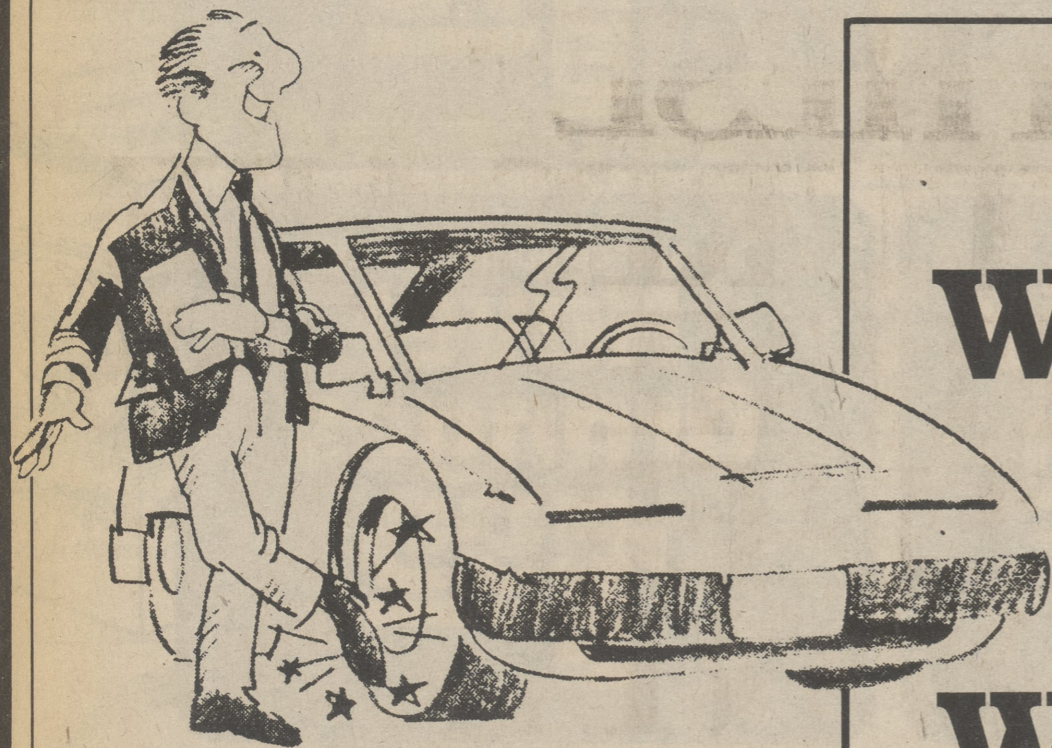

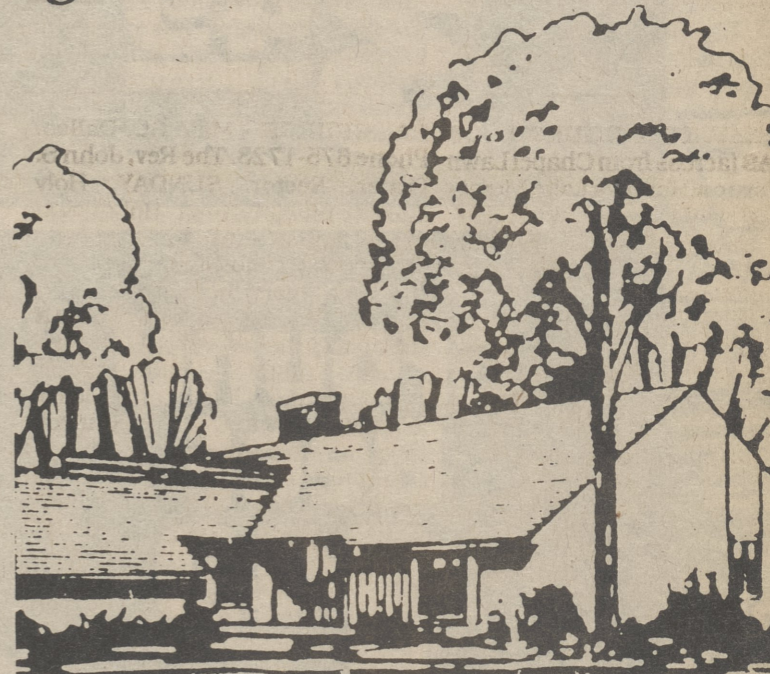

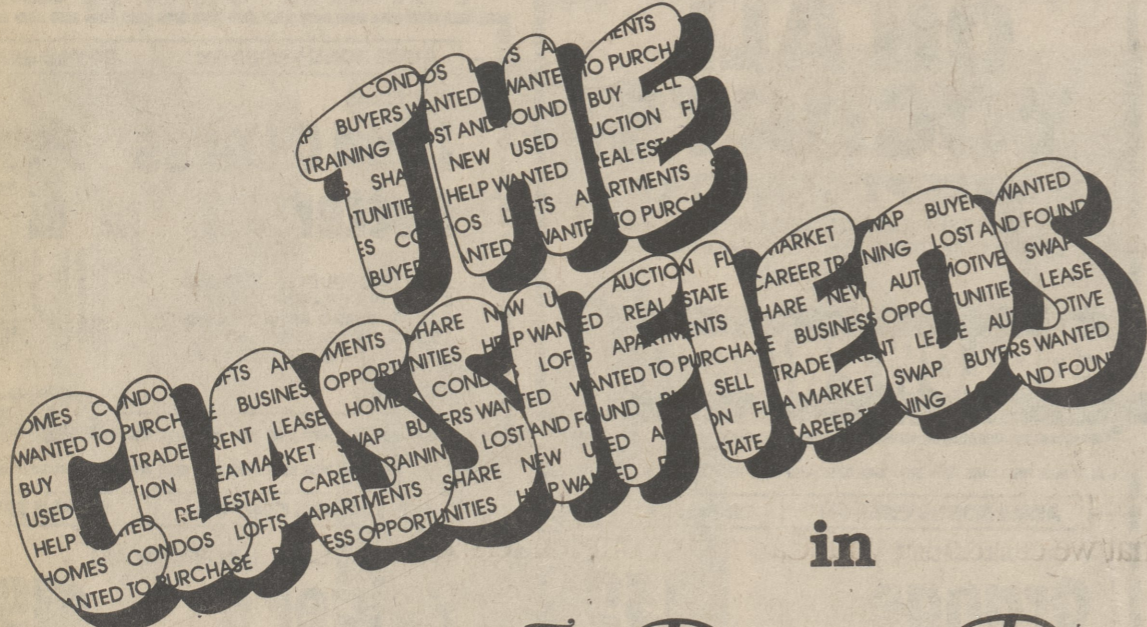
