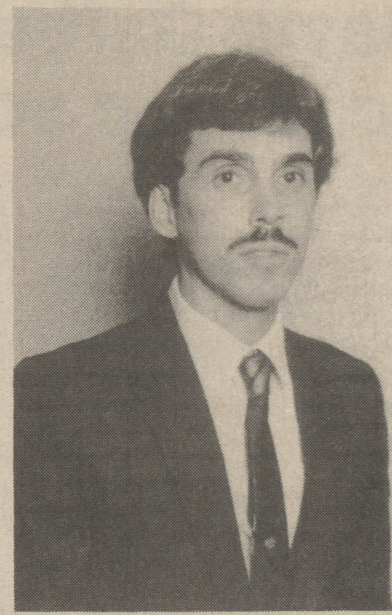
Mr. Sharok wants his students to be entertained, enlightened, but most of all, educated; and he strongly believes that his program accomplishes his goal.
