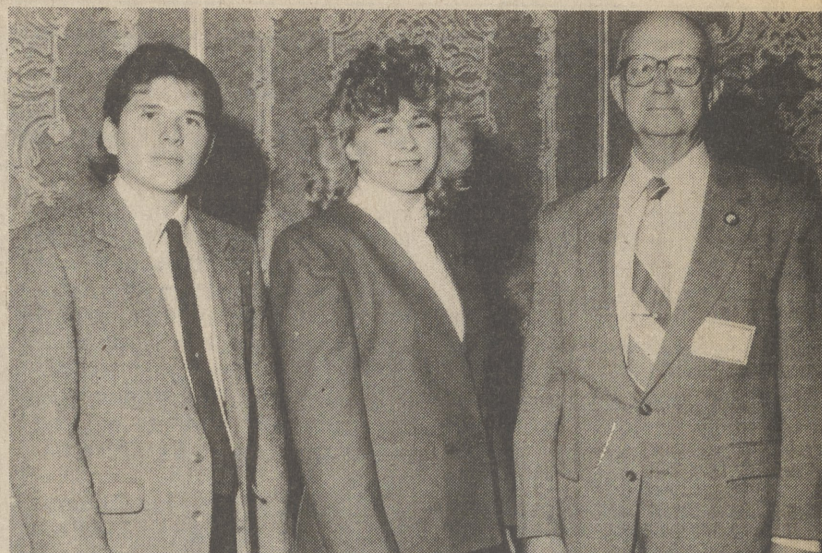

David Garber receives academic scholarship

Two Wilkes College students, Renee Strucke, Dupont and David Garber, Shavertown, were announced recently as recipients of The Charles B. Reif Scholarship for the Biological Sciences.

The scholarship was established by former students of Dr. Reif, many of whom are physicians, dentists, researchers and teachers. The establishment of the fund recognizes Dr. Reif's many years of service to Wilkes as a professor of biology and chairman of Wilkes Biology Department. Reif Scholarships are provided annually for students who wish to pursue the study of biological sciences.

Garber, a senior majoring in both biology and chemistry, is the recipient of numerous scholarships and awards, including the Ameri-

can Chemical Society Undergraduate Award in Analytical Chemistry (1988); Wilkes Biological Society Outstanding Sophomore (1986-87); Wilkes Chemical Society Outstanding Freshman (1985-86); Wilkes Trustee Scholarship (1985-1989); and Dallas High School Class Valedictorian (1985).

He is president of Wilkes Chemical Society, and a member of the college's Biological Society, Judicial Council, and Wind Ensemble.

Garber has given several scientific presentations, including one in 1987 at Columbia University where he completed an undergraduate fellowship. He also worked at Wilkes as a teaching assistant in the chemistry laboratory.

The three year olds will attend Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings beginning January 31 until March 16. The four year olds will participate Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday mornings from May 2 through May 19. The project runs from 8:55 a.m. until 11:05 a.m. The calendar and times for each session will be available at registration time. The above schedule is subject to changes and vacations in the regular school calendar.

Some time changes will be announced as school activities require.

Transportation will be the responsibility of the family. The Child Development classes at the Dallas Senior High School are developing the projects and activities for the Nursery School to be conducted by the children in conjunction with their studies. Parents of children who became three years old before January 1, 1989, or four years old before January 1, 1989, who wish to have their children participate in the project may register the child at the Senior High School office between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Tuesday, Jan. 10, and any day through Friday, Jan. 13. Should school be closed due to inclement weather, the registration will be held on the next school day. Sixteen children from each age group will be accepted on a sponsonibility of the family.

The children will participate in group and individual play activities, and lessons, as well as free play times. Additional information will be provided at the time of registration. The Nursery School Project is under the direction of Mrs. Nancy Goeringer, Child Development teacher.
