David, a senior at Dallas High School, briefed his brother on the benefits of an Air Force career and told him of his plans to enter the Air Force after graduation.

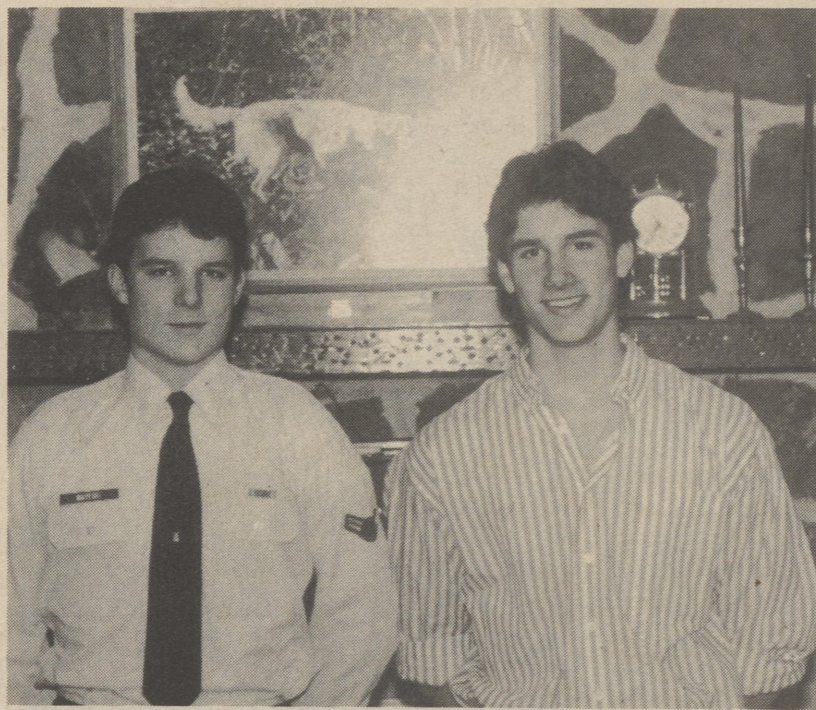
After hearing his brother talk about the Air Force, Leo decided to find out more about the Air Force; after meeting with his recruiter, he

Dallas residents, the boys' parents are the former Carol Kishbaugh of Forty Fort and Mr. Leo Mayeski.



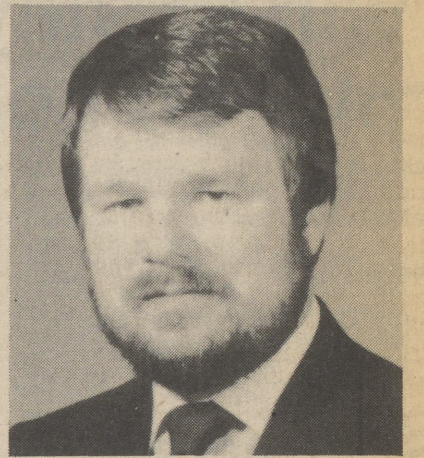
IT'S THE AIR FORCE FOR THEM - Alc Leo Mayeski, left and his brother, David Mayeski.

Officer Gdosky and his wife, Joan, will continue to reside at Dallas, where he will enjoy his retirement.

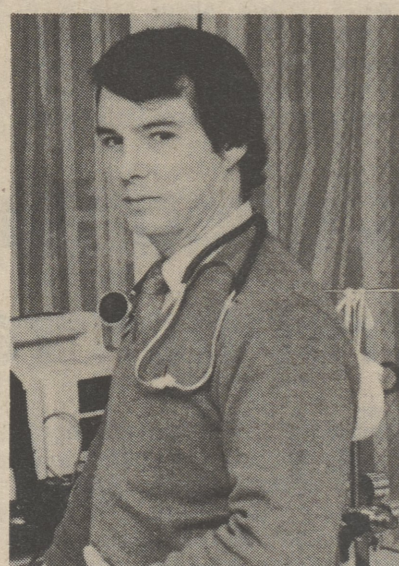
Dr. Litchman is certified in emergency medicine


