Dallas Weis Market expands

Shoppers will find the enlarged and remodeled Weis Market in Dallas ready for their carts this week. The store, which had been undergoing renovations since last fall, began a re-opening celebration Tuesday.

"It's our way of saying 'thank you' to our customers for putting up with inconvenience while the remodeling was going on," said Carol Ernst, a Weis spokesperson.

The store has been expanded from 26,000 square feet to 37,000, and every department has grown. The frozen foods area has grown

the most, because that department is the fastest-growing in the industry, according to Ms. Ernst.

In addition, several new departments and features have been added. They include a fresh fish service counter, a salad bar, a hot soup bar featuring daily specials, a flower shop, and a Colonial Bake Shop.

Weis Markets first opened in Dallas in 1971 and the store was remodeled once, in 1979. The current project is one of several that the Sunbury based chain schedules each year.

The remodeled store includes an expanded produce area which features "mistlers", devices that spray fresh produce constantly with a fine mist of water. This keeps loose produce such as lettuce and celery fresher, Ms. Ernst said.

As part of the re-opening celebration, there will be "early bird" specials for the first 300 shoppers each day, special prize drawings and free balloons for children. Ms. Ernst said there would also be many special bargains made available by Weis suppliers as part of the event.

Officer James Martin answered a call February 23 at the Dallas Post Office where he found that sometime between 5:30 p.m. and 5:09 a.m. someone allegedly placed lighted matches in the out-of-town mailed boxes at the rear of the post office and the contents in the box were on fire.

Officer Martin extinguished the fire and contacted postal authorities.

Superintendent Ray Ceconi said that mail which was not damaged would be sent to addressees but if mail was charred it would be returned to sender.

He told Miers the car went out of control and slid into the other lane where it struck a truck head-on.

The officer advised Hensen to seek medical attention. Neighbors questioned by the police said they heard nothing.

Two injured in 3-car crash on 309 Tuesday afternoon

A three-car accident on Route 309 in Trucksville at approximately 1:00 p.m. Tuesday afternoon sent two persons to Nesbitt Hospital.

The accident occurred on Route 309 near Gorda's Service Station when Mrs. John Gorda was waiting in the passing lane to turn left into the business. Janet Kozick, traveling south behind Gorda, was unable to stop in time, striking the Gorda vehicle, bouncing off and then hitting a van driven by Joseph Ostrowski.

Kingston Township and Dallas Borough ambulances removed the

injured women to the Nesbitt Memorial Hospital where they were admitted for treatment.

Kingston Township Patrolman Robert Weiss was the investigating officer.

The investigation was continuing Tuesday afternoon.

Fire destroys House of Nutrition

Kunkle Fire Chief Jack Dodson and state fire marshal William Balchune are continuing to investigate a fire which struck the House of Nutrition health food store on route 309 in Kunkle last Wednesday night.

The fire, which was discovered by a passing motorist at approxi-

mately 11:07 p.m., gutted one of the rooms and destroyed the items in it. The fire was in the ceiling of the building, which is owned by Tom Swartwood of Dallas. The building was originally owned by Leon Race of Kunkle.

Dodson said the fire did not appear to be suspicious but ap-

parently due to an electrical malfunction. He said Swartwood was talking about remodeling the building and reopening for business as soon as possible.

Vitamins, dairy products, natural and organic foods, frozen foods and desserts were sold from the store.

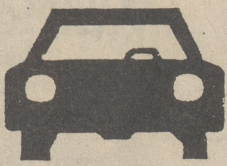
