The remodeled store includes an expanded produce area which features "misters", devices that spray fresh produce constantly with a fine mist of water. This keeps loose produce such as lettuce and celery fresher, Ms. Ernst said.

As part of the re-opening celebration, there will be "early bird" specials for the first 300 shoppers each day, special prize drawings and free balloons for children. Ms. Ernst said there would also be many special bargains made available by Weis suppliers as part of the event.


