Misericordia names new president

Dr. Pasquale "Pat" DiPasquale, who has been named president of College Misericordia, announced Misericordia's Chairman of the Board John Churnetski. Dr. DiPasquale of Miami, Florida, will assume the leadership position on June 1.

The presidential search committee presented the board with four strong candidates," explained Churnetski. "After considerable discussion at our February board meeting, we agreed that Dr. DiPasquale was the candidate that best fits the needs of College Misericordia."

DiPasquale replaces Dr. Joseph Fik who resigned from Misericordia in September, 1988 to accept the presidency of Dominican College of San Rafael in San Francisco. Executive vice president Dr. Bruce Wilson has been serving as acting president since that time.

The 60-year-old DiPasquale has experience as both an educator and an administrator. He began his career as a lay missionary in Africa where he met his wife, Charlotte, who was also serving as a lay missionary. In 1961, the two were married in the United States and DiPasquale began teaching English at Ston Hill College in Greensburg, Pennsylvania. During the next several years, he continued to teach first at the University of Oregon and then Illinois State University.

In 1972, DiPasquale began a five year tenure as the first lay president of Assumption College in Worcester, Massachusetts. In July 1977, he was named president of Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa, the first lay president in the 138-year history of the college. After 10 years at Loras College, he became the first lay president of St. Thomas University in Miami, Florida.

Prior to accepting the position at Misericordia, DiPasquale was acting as a consultant to St. Thomas. DiPasquale and his wife, have

three adult daughters.

Dr. DiPasquale received his doctorate degree in English literature from the University of Pittsburgh. As a Fulbright scholar, he attended Oxford University where he earned his masters and bachelors degrees. In addition, he holds a bachelors degree from the University of Notre Dame. In 1987, the Notre Dame Club of Dubuque presented him with the Award of the year, and Assumption College named a building in his honor, the DiPasquale Media Center, which was built during his presidency.

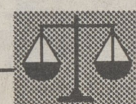
William Berti retains position as Dallas Civil Defense Director

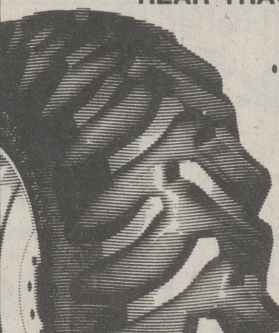

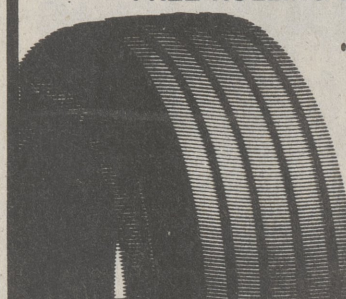
