Mr. Ben Davis, nominations chairman announced that nominations for the 1989 Youth Salute are now being accepted.

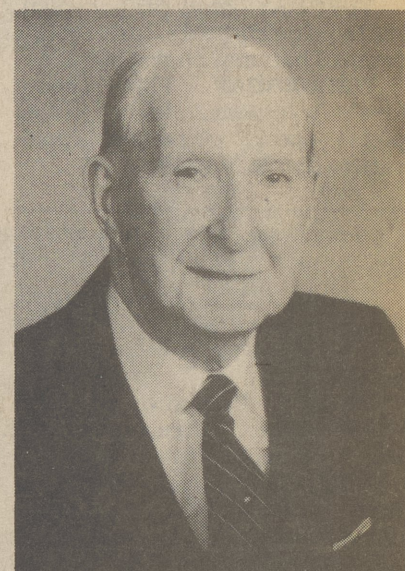

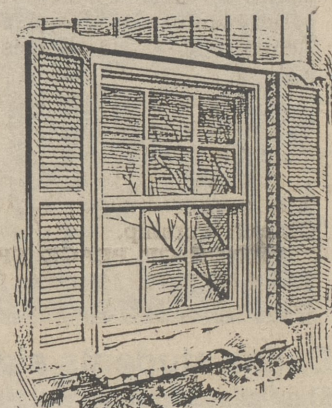


