Wuster, pastoral minister, St. Pius School, San Antonio, TX.

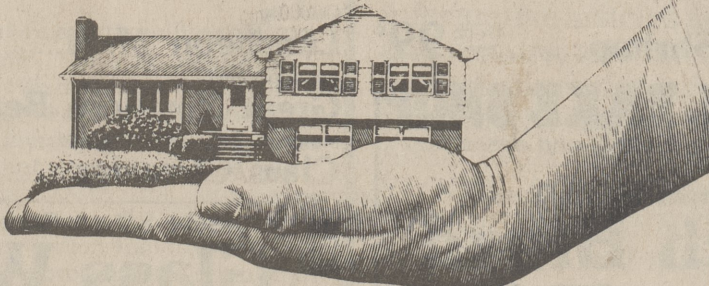
Sr. Urban, native of Ebensburg, PA has a B.S. in Secretarial Science from College Misericordia and an M.A. in Business Education from Catholic University.
