## Water commission offers conservation tips

The drought watch in effect for much of the Northeastern United States, including Pennsylvania and Luzerne County has prompted the Back Mountain Regional Water Commission to urge all residents to conserve water. This recommendation is for everyone, whether they have individual wells, or are served by one of the local water companies. With community-wide cooperation it is hoped that more stringent water restrictions will not be necessary.

Water conservation measures that can be put into practice without undue inconvenience are as follows:

1. Run only full loads in the washing machine or dishwasher.
2. Don't run water while brushing teeth or shaving.
3. Keep a bottle of water in the refrigerator to use for cold drinking water, instead of running the

water until it is cold.  
4. When washing a car, use a bucket for soaping, and a hose nozzle that shuts off when not in use for rinsing.

5. Don't wash down driveways, house or garage. Sweep with a broom instead.

6. Limit toilet flushing. Don't use the toilet as a waste basket. Put jugs of water into the toilet tank to reduce volume of water used in each flush. Two 2-liter soda bottles will fit. If any toilet needs to be replaced, buy a water saving model. Put food dye into the tank to see if the seat is leaking.

7. Repair all leaks, dripping faucets, or running toilets.

8. Take short showers instead of baths, or long showers.

9. Reuse water from rinsing dishes, or washing vegetables and fruit to water plants.

The Department makes every effort to correct every pothole problem in a timely manner.
