Register for Lake-Lehman kindergarten next week

It is the policy of the Board of School Directors of the Lake-Lehman School District that in order for a child to be eligible to enter the public schools in the district, he/she must have attained the age of five years on or before September 30. A birth certificate must be presented at the time of registration.

Kindergarten in the Lake-Lehman School District is an all-day program.

Registration for kindergarten will be held in the Lake-Lehman Elementary Schools according to the following alphabetical schedule of the last name:

Ross Elementary, Friday, April 21, 8:30-10:30 (A thru O); 12:30-1:30 (P thru Z).

Immunization Requirements: The Pennsylvania Department of Health has established immunization requirements for all children entering school. Parents must provide the school with documented proof (physician's record)

of immunizations, which includes the month, day and year of each immunization.

Your child will not be registered for school unless this immunization information is presented at registration. The required immunizations are:

DPT-Series of three (3) doses
Polio-Series of three (3) doses
Measles-One (1) after 1 year of age

Rubella-One (1) after 1 year of age

Mumps-One (1) after 1 year of age.

Vision, Speech and hearing screenings will be conducted on each registrant.

Many feel Kingston Township police salaries still too low

Interviews with residents and businesspersons in Truckville and Shavertown support the Kingston Township Police Officers Association's contention that they are underpaid, despite recent raises granted by an arbitration award.

Monica Marner, a Truckville resident and owner of Pata Pet, said she knows many of the township police officers who are underpaid for people who are risking their lives for citizens every work hour.

Michael Marner, a four-year veteran of the force and chairman of the bargaining unit, said he was disappointed with the new salary arbitrator he called in. Tipter said that the officers must be given a chance to see the retirement program was a major stumbling block. He did not disagree with the contention that the former salary schedule was inadequate. "\$14,100 was low, I agree with that," he said.

James Newell, owner of Newell's Fuel in Truckville, agreed. "It's not a lot," he said, referring to the township's police force. "I don't have the best police protection in the state. I've seen them in action. I know the work he [Newell] had to do to make enough money to get by."

Under the recently completed salary arbitration, several township departments will earn \$16,000 annually as of June 1. They had been earning \$14,100 a year in
