## Montessori school offers day camp

The history of the Wyoming Valley from its earliest residents, to its first 40 settlers to its waves of immigrants will set the theme for a three-week summer day camp sponsored by the Wyoming Valley Montessori School.

"Our Great Great Grandparents Were Kids Once Too" will be offered during the weeks of July 10-14, July 17-21 and July 24-28 with the first week focusing on Indian heritage, the second on pioneer days and the third on ethnic traditions.

Children ages 3-10 may enroll for one, two or three weeks. The children will be divided by age group with a camp circle for 3 to 4 years old, one for 5 to 7 years olds and a third for 8 to 10 year olds.

Camp runs from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. weekdays. Children bring lunch from home, but snacks-in keeping with the week's theme, will be provided.
