King's is an independent, four-year, coeducational institution founded by the Holy Cross Fathers.

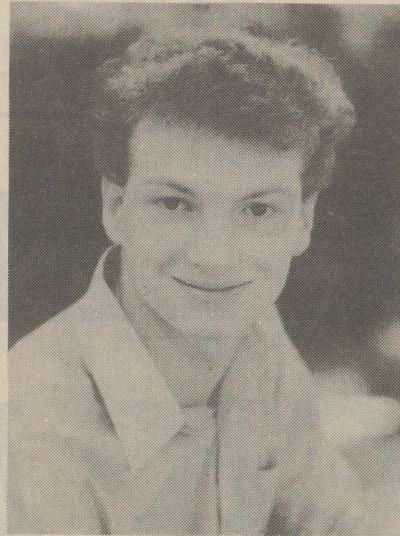


Morreale advises Circle-K

Penn State seminar seeks to add creativity to teaching

Educators, especially those involved in staff development and continuing education, will have the opportunity to revitalize themselves and their classes next month through a unique one-day Penn State program on creative teaching techniques.

A workshop entitled "Resuscitate Your Teaching: Breathe New Life Into the Same Old Stuff" has been scheduled 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., Wednesday, May 10, at the Sheraton Crossgates on Public Square.

The program will explore the reasons for educator burnout and identify mental blocks to creativity. The humanistic teacher-learner relationship will be discussed as well as many techniques for making teaching and learning an exciting experience.

The workshop instructor will be Sheri Blatt Stern, R.N.C., a critical care nurse with seven years experience teaching baccalaureate

nursing students at Towson State University. She also presents workshops nationwide on both clinical and educational topics.

She holds undergraduate and graduate degrees from University of Maryland and is author of articles published in nursing journals.

She has become known for her fun in education philosophy and her belief that learning is best achieved through memorable experiences and self-discovery.

The Pennsylvania Nursing Association and the Pennsylvania State Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators have approved this program for six hours.

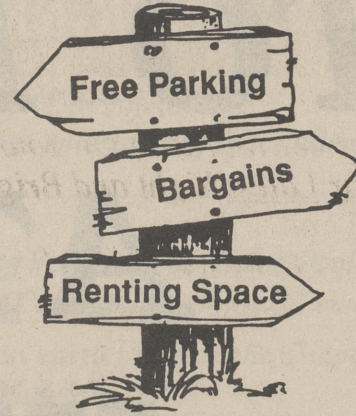

Art contest winners

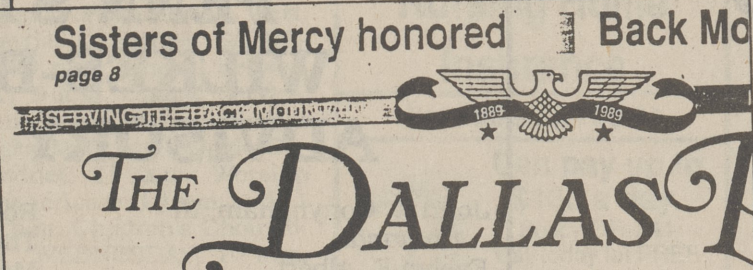
