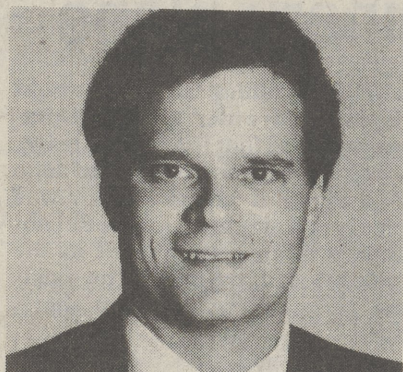
Dr. Raymond will be listed in the first edition of the "National Register of Professional Disability Consultants" to be published next year.
