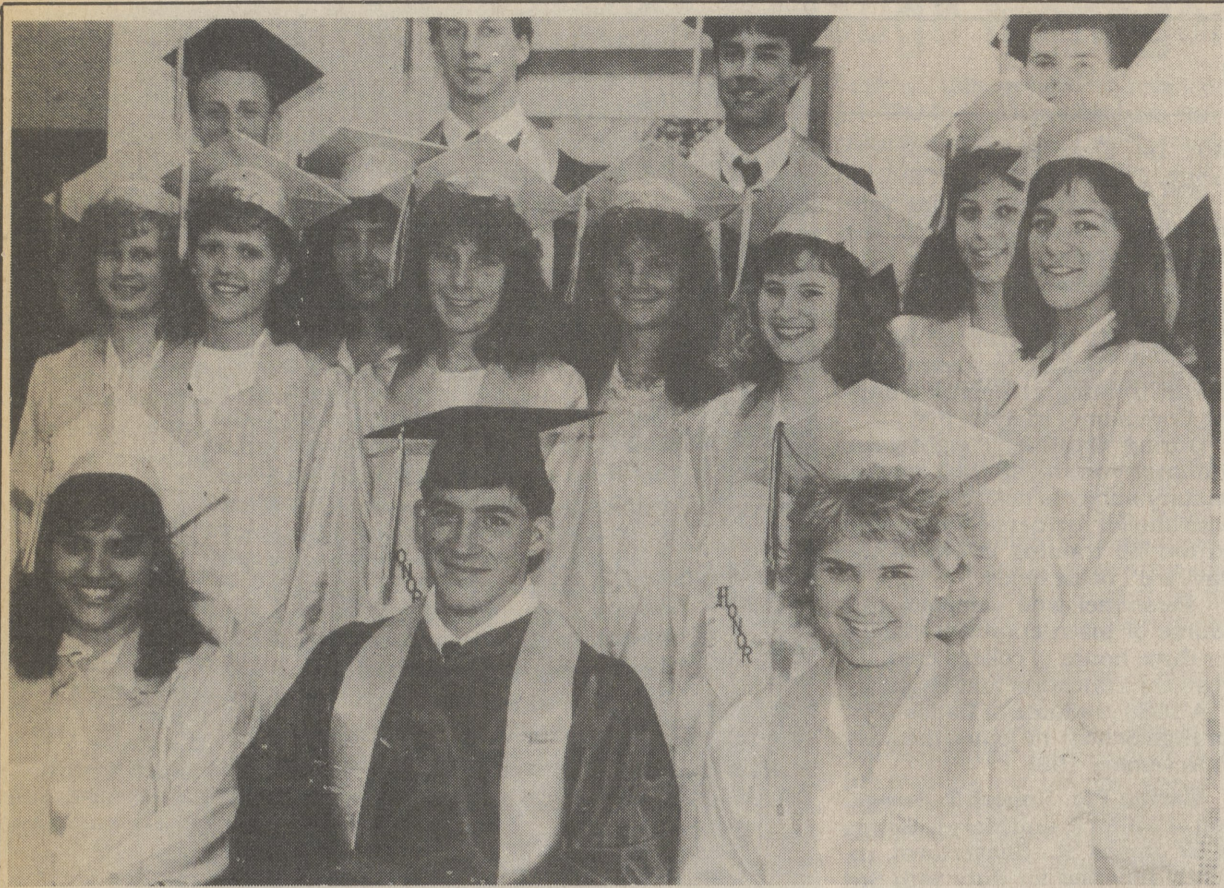
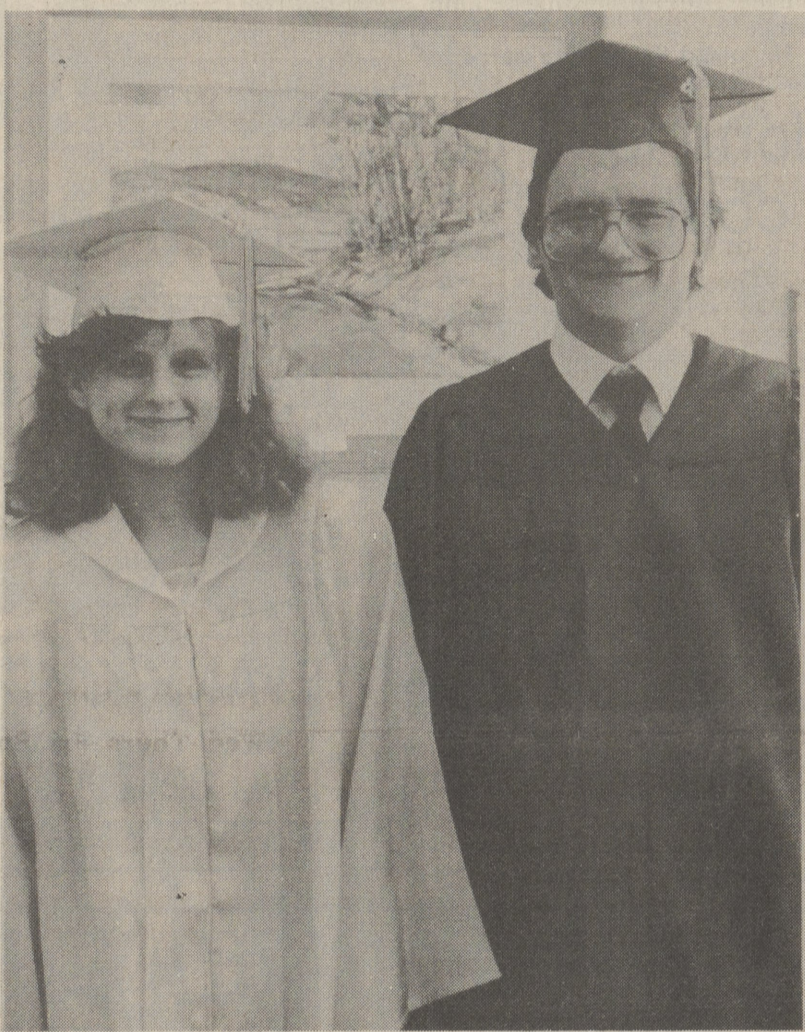

Among the LCCC faculty members who received promotions was Kate Jenkins, Shavertown, promoted to associate professor of business.

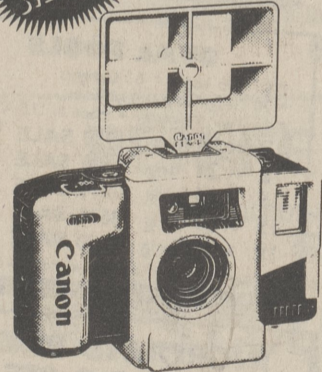
