Back Mountain advances with 18-5 win

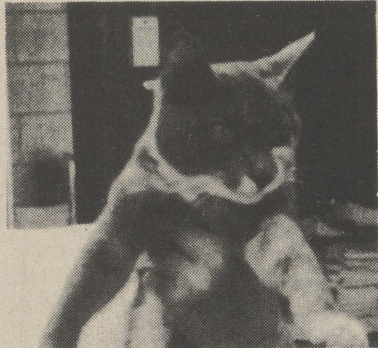
