The Penn State Club of Wyoming Valley will hold its annual football preview dinner and program on Friday, July 28, at the Wyoming Valley Country Club.

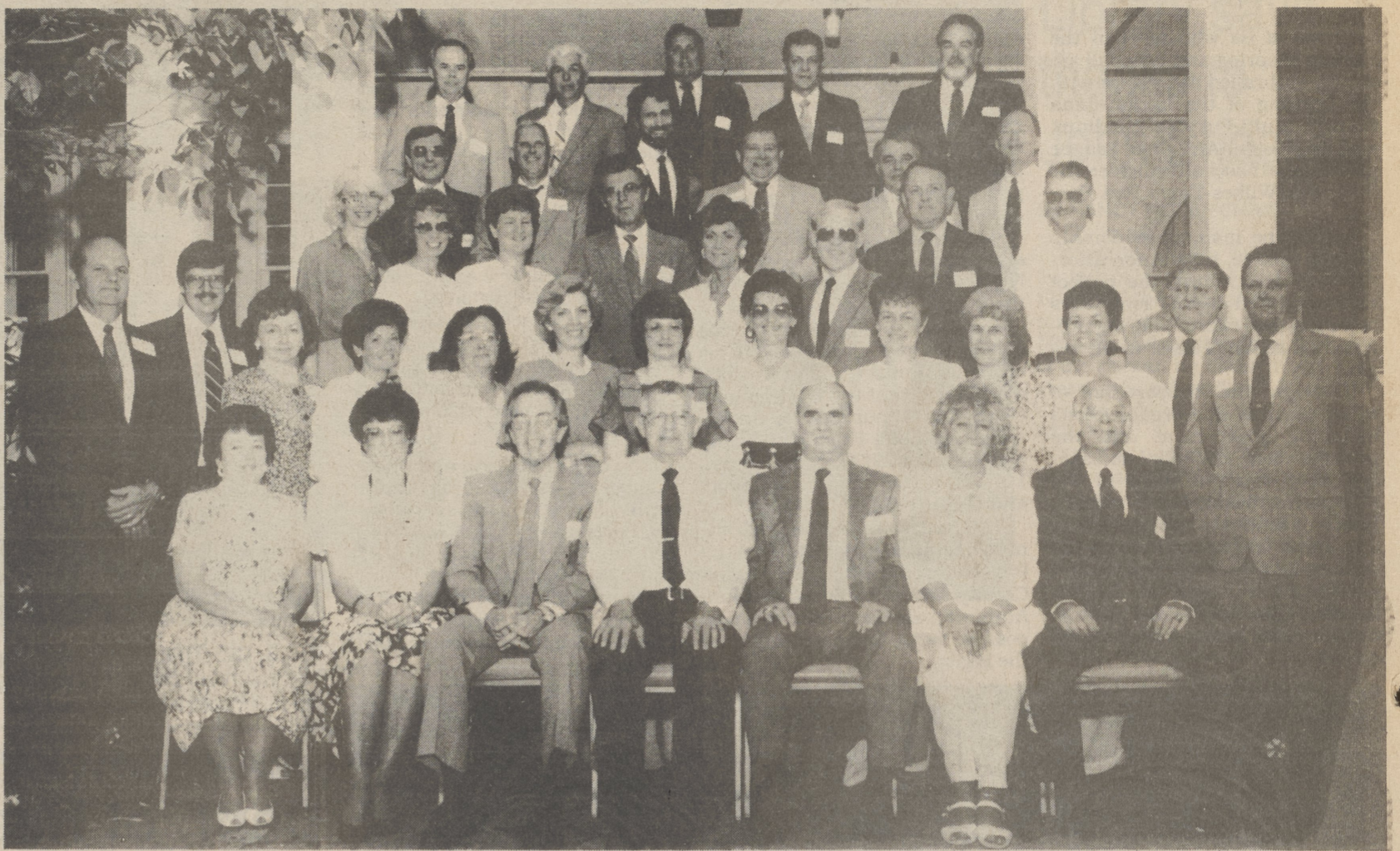
Cocktails and reception begin at six and full-course dinner will be served at 7 p.m. followed at 8:30 p.m. by a football program.

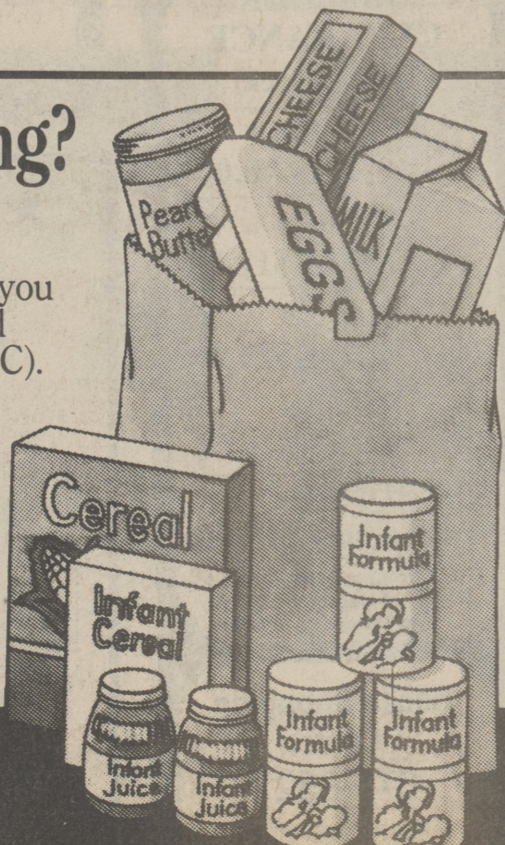
