Shavertown Methodist to launch capital campaign

A \$100,000 Centennial Capital Campaign will be launched by the Shavertown United Methodist Church during the Worship Services on Saturday, Aug. 26 and Sunday, Aug. 27. Keith Atherholt, Chairperson of the Campaign Committee, will make the presen-

tations. This campaign honors the Church's 100th Anniversary of its founding, to be celebrated in September 1990. It is a capital fund drive whose goal is to raise \$100,000. The purpose is to install a new gas-fired furnace and to

modify the Church's total heating system for efficiency. In addition, other improvements to the Church buildings and properties include: air conditioning for the sanctuary; a new garage with storage area; cleaning and re-pointing the external brickwork; a

barrier-free access for persons of special needs; renewing ceilings and painting the classrooms; and improving the parking lots, all recommendations from the Board of Trustees, led by John Bunney. The financial goal will be reached by Advance Gifts and by pledges.
