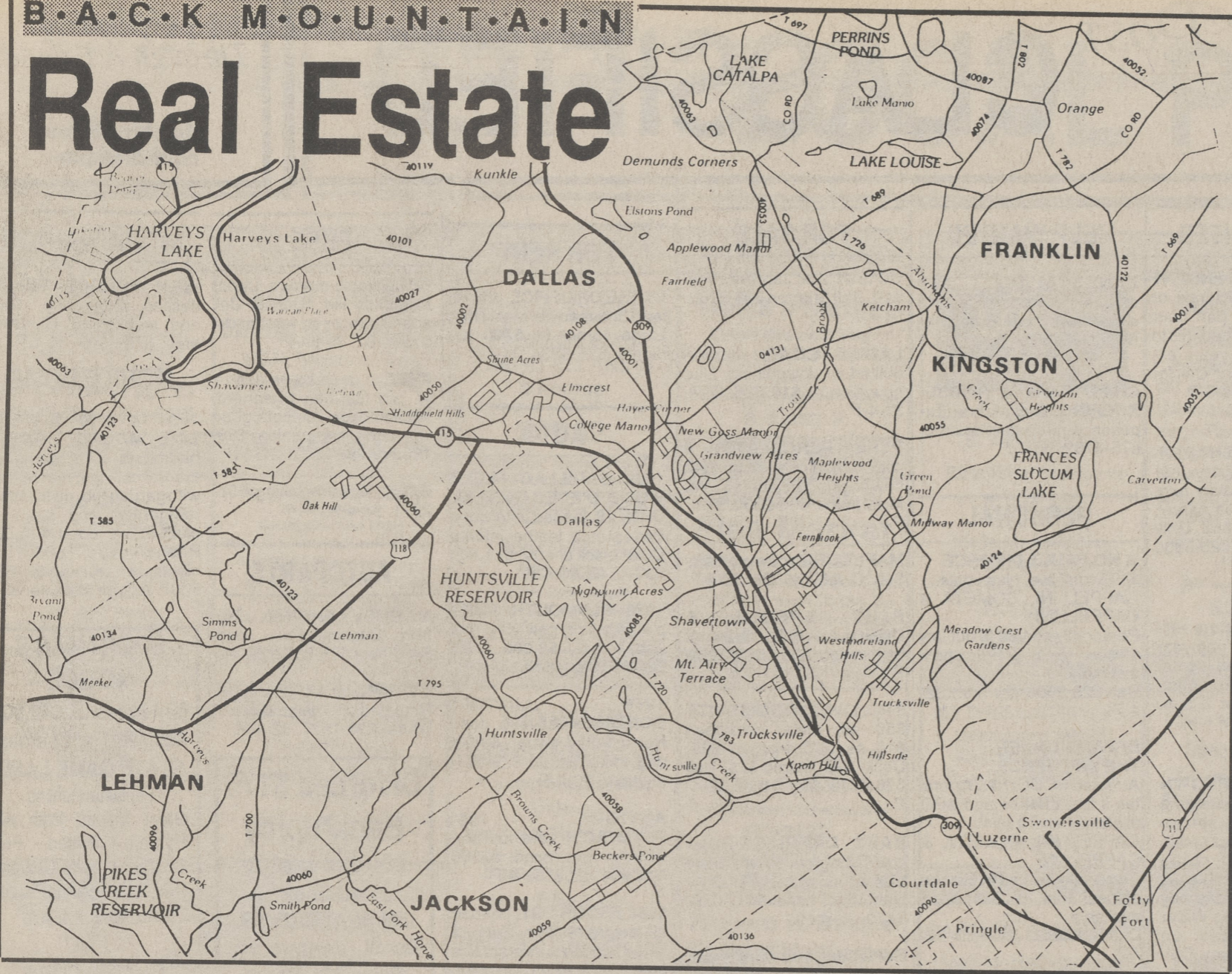

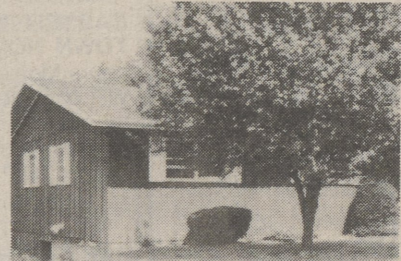

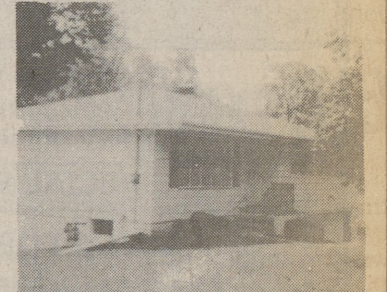

Ross advances status in health care executive group

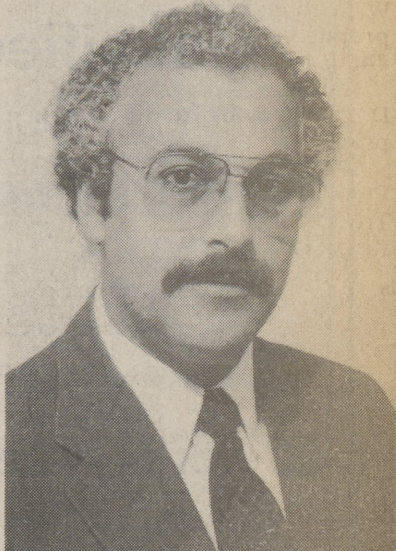
