Harveys Lake apartment building damaged by fire

One Harveys Lake woman was transported to the hospital and another resident escaped injury after an apartment house caught fire Friday evening.

Harveys Lake firefighters responded to a fire at Pole 189, Lakeside Drive, Harveys Lake, about 5:30 p.m., according to Fire Chief John Martinson. The owner of the home, Helan Bennet, and her son were home at the time of the fire.

Bennet, who suffers from a cardiac problem, was transported to Nesbitt Memorial Hospital for observation. Her son was not injured, according to Martinson.

The fire was contained to the kitchen of the two apartment, single-story building, Martinson said the fire was believed to have been started by a propane gas explosion. The rest of the home suffered smoke and water damage.

12 firefighters from Harveys Lake responded to the fire. Kunkle Volunteer Fire Department assisted at the scene.
