Sophomore Chris Williams made it 7-0 by kicking the extra point.

Sam Jayne did his part in the scoring by leading the drive for the Dallas Mountaineers. In the second quarter, Mount George Ladamus intercepted a Spartan pass at the Valley West 24-yard line to set up a second Dallas touchdown. Tony Baldo scored the six points for the Mountaineers by going over from the 12-yard line and Chris Williams again kicked the extra point to give Dallas a 14-0 lead.

In the third period, the Mountaineers scored a third time when Barry Miller tipped a Spartan pass on the Dallas 46-yard line, then Jeremiah VanOrden caught a 29-
