11. Do you find yourself changing your habits, way of dress, or behavior to suit him/ her?

12. Do you like yourself less after you have been with him/ her?

If you answer YES to these questions, especially those concerning control and anger, your relationship is becoming an abusive one. Be wary of someone who is jealous, who doesn't want you to improve yourself, or doesn't want you to have many friends. If you don't like yourself after you've been with him/her, be concerned about those feelings
