The Knights got off to a quick start in Monday's game driving down the field for a touchdown in 8:44 of the first quarter. The Knights scored their second touchdown in the beginning of the second quarter when Mike Strutko went over from 34 yards. On the following kickoff, the Knights recovered a Hoban fumble and Ron Lefkoski took the ball into the end zone but it was called back on an illegal blocking penalty.

Martin wasn't to be denied the score and went up the middle to score at 5:59 left in the half. On the first play of the Knights next possession, Martin scored again going for a 33-yard touchdown to give the Knights a 27-0 lead.

In the second half the Knights scored another touchdown when Matt Kukosky capped a 66-yard drive by the Knights by carrying the ball into the end zone from the one yard line. Kukosky scored another touchdown for the Knights on a 34-yard run to give the Knights their 41-14 win. Sam Gorgone kicked the extra points.

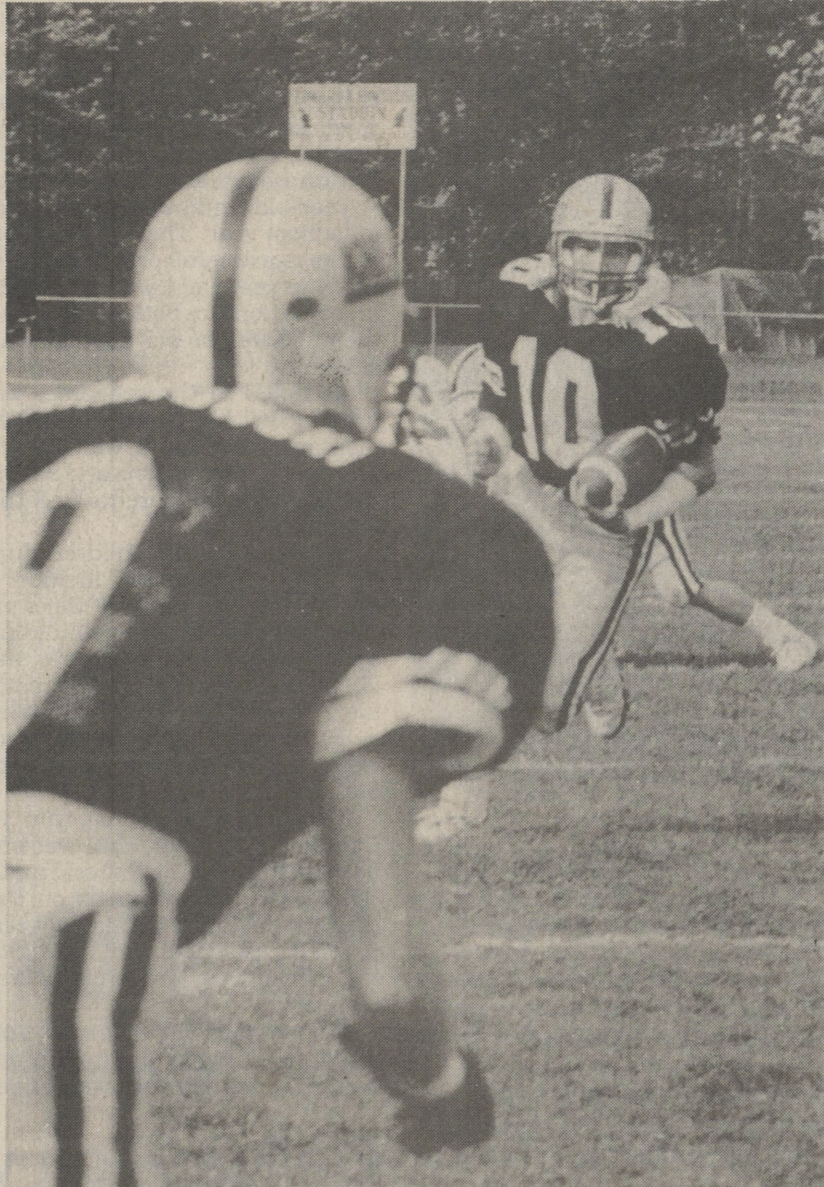
Hoban's two touchdowns were scored by Ken Strish on a 12-yard pass to Shawn McHale and by Kevin Quaglia on a 30-yard run.
