Lake-Lehman slates program for 4-year-olds

Mr. Charles James and Mr. Robert Kunkle, Elementary Principals for the Lake-Lehman School District, announce the Pre-School Program for parents and pre-school (4-year-old) children for the 1989-90 school year. The continuation of the successful program, initiated five years ago, will feature six presentations for both parents and their children as per the following schedule:

As noted in the schedule, the program will be offered at each elementary school and will feature separate presentations and activities for both the parents and the children.

Activities for the children during these programs will include: a play/game time; a story time; an orientation to the school building and special purpose rooms, i.e. library, cafeteria, gym, health room; make and take/arts and crafts; safety in the home and neighborhood and orientation to busing, etc.

The programs for parents in October, November, and December will deal with reading and math readiness, and will focus on the concept of a partnership between parents and school, and the role of the parent as the child's first teacher.

The sessions in February and March will focus on nutrition, health, bus safety and orientation,

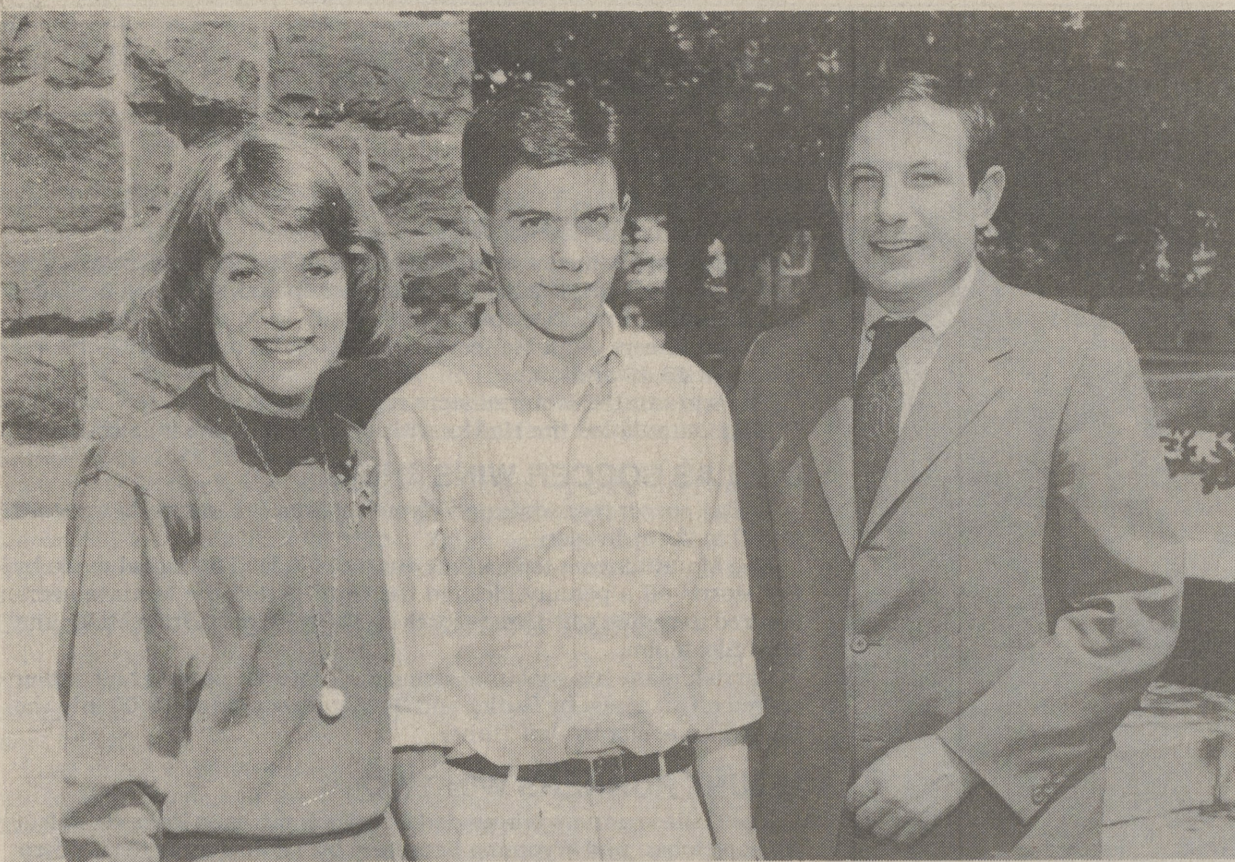
