## KT leaves pick-up this week

Kingston Township Road Superintendent Robert Chamberlain has announced the annual pickup of bagged leaves has been scheduled for October 30 through November 3. Residents are advised to have leaves bagged and placed at the curbside for pickup. The pickup is limited to bagged leaves only. Township crews will be conducting the pickup between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Road Superintendent Chamberlain asks the cooperation of residents in refraining from sweeping leaves into gutters and roadways. The leaves tend to block storm drains and this poses a serious maintenance problem to the Road Department. A township ordinance also prohibits this practice.

Leaf pickup will proceed as weather permits and snow removal will supersede all other maintenance activity.

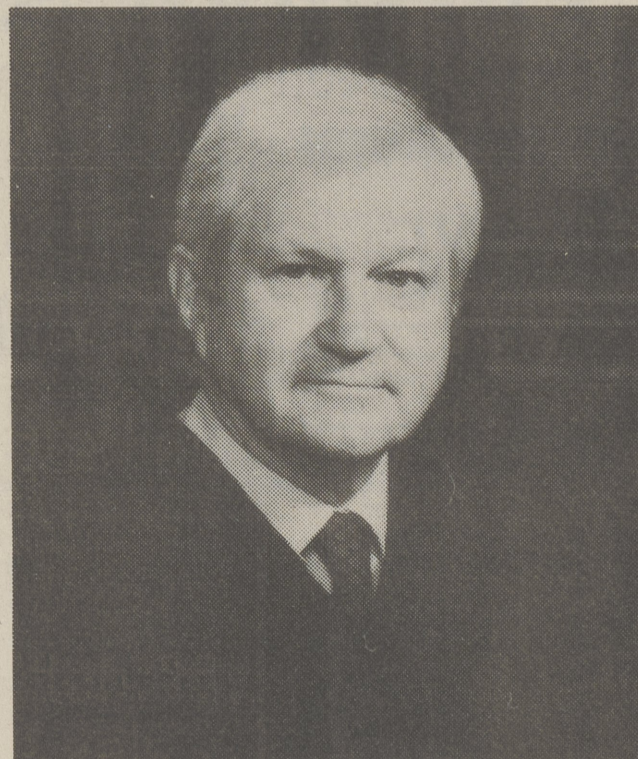

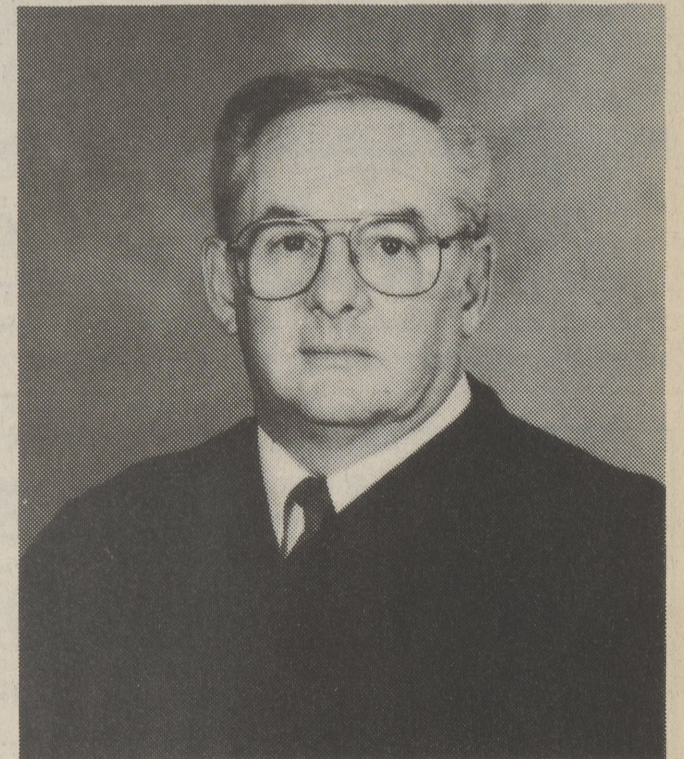
