they have been engaged in church planting ministry in Nanticoke.

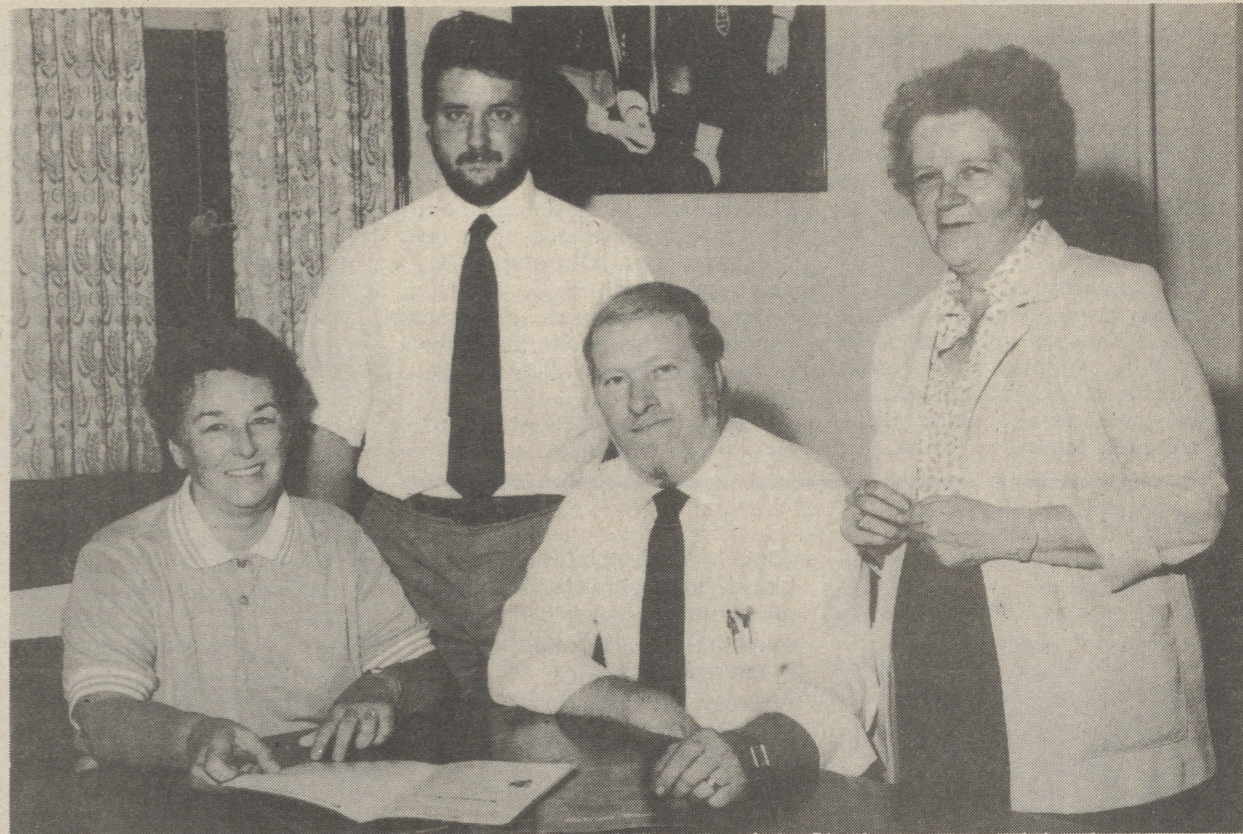

Lake-Lehman band continues winning

The Lake-Lehman High School Band has continued its successful winning season in band competitions by taking first place in three recent events.

At South Brunswick, New Jer-

sey, the Black Knights marched off with the best overall band award as well as trophies for all specialty categories. Lehman competed against 10 of New Jersey's best high school bands.

At the "Children's Miracle March Competition" at the Lackawanna County Stadium, the Knights captured every first place award in their group and were awarded the judges best overall trophy. Sixteen high school marching bands from Eastern Pennsylvania and New York participated.

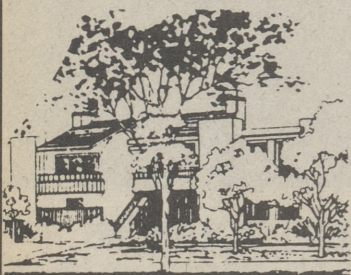

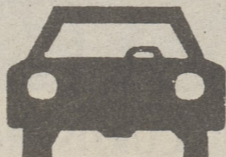
