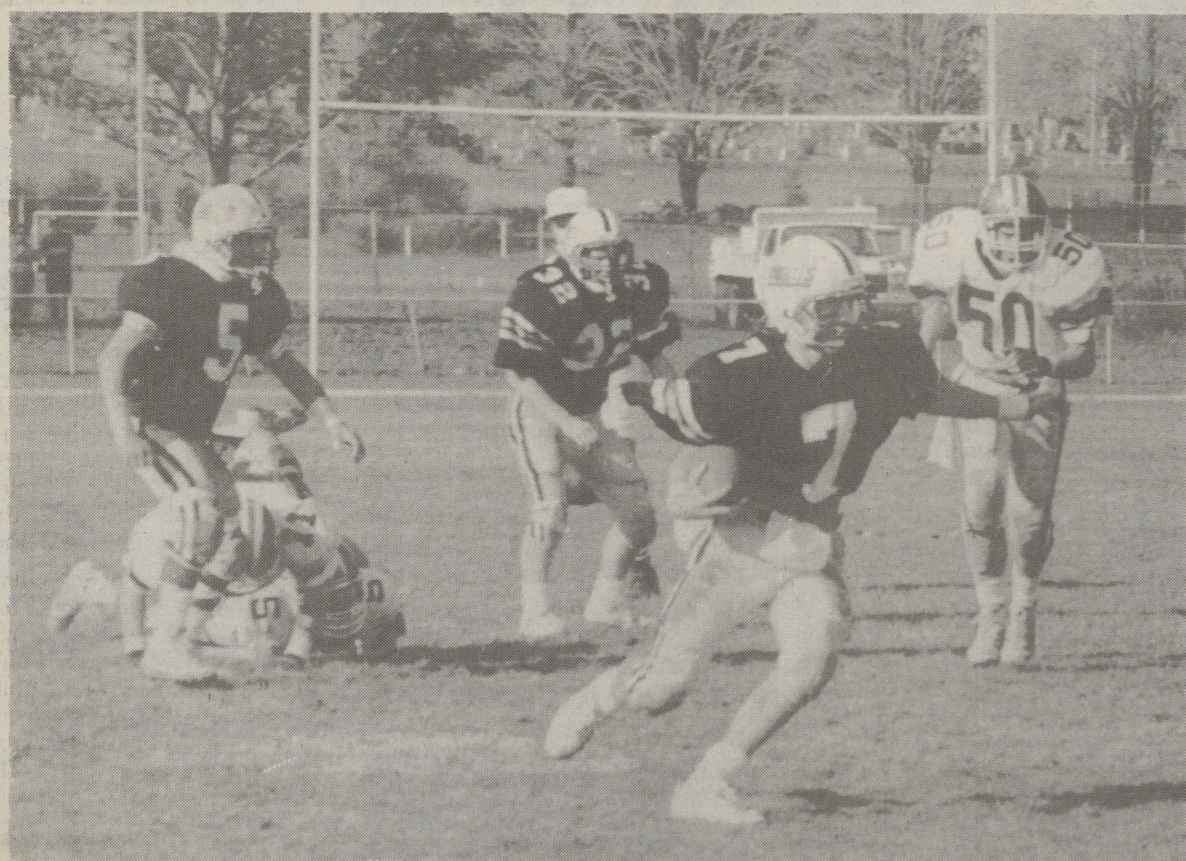

## Knights dominate Nanticoke in 34-0 win

Lake-Lehman let Nanticoke know from the beginning of Saturday's game that the Knights had come out to win as they scored two touchdowns in the first quarter. They continued a strong offensive attack to win 34-0 and make it a great day for the Knights homecoming.

"There's no doubt the offense dominated Saturday's game," Coach Rich Gorgone said following his Knights' win. "They played a great game. In the third quarter we started seven juniors. Since the Meyers game our offense has been playing well. They have improved greatly on becoming physical."

Running back Terry Martin scored three touchdowns on 150

yards in the first half and finished the day with a total of 181 yards on 23 carries. His work last Saturday earned him WARD Radio's Player of the Game trophy.

Martin scored the Knights' first touchdown when he went over from the 13-yard line to give them a 6-0 lead. Ron Lefkowski covered 20 yards on the play;

Martin rushed for 46 yards when he took a pass from Sam Gorgone.

In the second period, the Knights moved to 20-0 when Martin went over from the five yard line. The kick on that score failed, but the Knights were in front 20-0.

In the third period Gorgone used eight plays to drive the

Knights 83 yards downfield, then faking to Martin Gorgone kept the ball and went over from the three-yard line. P.J. Goodwin kicked the extra point and the Knights were in front 27-0.

In the final quarter the Knights used six plays to move to the five yard line from where Bill Vigorito went in for a score and Australian exchange student Peter Haxton kicked the extra

point to give the Knights their 34-0 win.

"This Saturday we play Crestwood at Crestwood and it won't be easy," Gorgone said. "They have a good offense and they're explosive. We can't take them lightly and they're right behind us in our division. Our kids will have to play another outstanding game."
