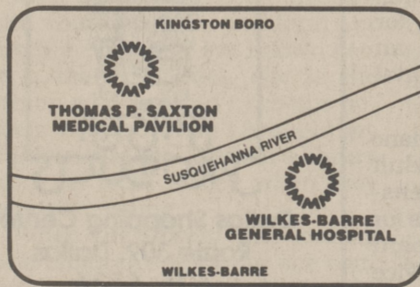

dents and grandson of Harold Elston, Reservoir Road, Huntsville.

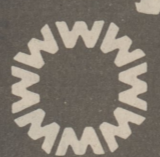
