## Dallas High Holiday Concert Sunday

The chorus returns with "Christmas is a Holiday of the Heart", with soloists Lisa Davenport and Berit Case. "Back to a Christmas Past" will be followed by selected Second Grade students from both Dallas

and Westmoreland and Elementary Schools singing, "My Two Front Teeth".

Tchaikovsky's "Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairy" and "A Christmas Finale" complete the Concert Band's solo performance. The concluding Choral segment includes "Behold, a Tiny Child" sung using sign language; "Christmas Day Is On Its Way" done by the Dal-Hi Choristers; "Come and See

### Dallas gets new borough manager

Milton Lusky of Dallas, a retired school teacher, was appointed borough manager by a unanimous vote of the borough council last Thursday night. Lusky, who lives in Dallas Borough, was a member of the Wyoming Valley School District for 27 years. He has a degree in business administration. Lusky will serve as interim manager until the council's regular meeting November 21. Council president Donald Shaffer said he didn't expect any problems with the permanent appointment of Lusky since all the council members appeared to be satisfied with his qualifications.

"In fact, he appears to be well qualified for the position and was accessible to get started. He came in Friday morning to prepare for his duties as secretary of the Dallas School Board which met Monday night."

"I'm trying to feel my way and see the time I take to serve everyone," Lusky said. "I'm becoming familiar with the forms, applications and the payroll, and on Friday I did some evening of the road crew."

"I need a secretary or clerk with experience, someone to do scheduling, typing and to answer the phone. After I'm here a while I'll let you know the council and help coordinate things. One of my top priorities will be to get a good routine set up for the borough."

Lusky will work part time and fall into place with time. He will be paid the remainder of the \$5,000 annual salary, former Dallas Borough manager Donald Shaffer was receiving.

If he is hired as expected, Lusky will be the first to hold the position since the borough was formed in 1889.

### Dallas Board lets \$1.4 million in contracts

The Dallas School Board approved the motion to award \$1.4 million in contracts for alterations and additions to the Dallas Senior High School at its regular meeting Monday night.

District superintendent Gerald Wyvalka noted in the auditorium that the contracts came to a total of \$1,395,881, a savings of more than \$600,000 over the original estimate of more than \$2 million for the high school project.

General construction for the senior high was awarded to Wilkins Construction, Dallas, in the amount of \$630,000; plumbing work was awarded to Contractors Group Inc., Luzerne, \$78,200; heating, ventilation and air conditioning was awarded to Bogert, Inc., Hazleton, \$221,111; and electrical work was awarded to G. H. Noto & Son, Inc., Elyon \$257,000.

The directors also approved payment to Ruth Corporation in the amount of \$6,292.90 for heating, air conditioning and ventilation at the Dallas Elementary School. The Dallas Elementary School Board approved \$2,443.50 for plumbing at the Dallas Elementary School and \$5,747.25 to Regan Electric for electrical work at the Dallas Elementary. They also approved payment to Luster Construction in the amount of \$36,054.02 for general construction at the school.

Wyvalka explained that the amount of more than \$2 million in the amount of \$36,054.02 for general construction at the school is 50 percent completed, heating is 75 percent completed, energy management work is finished, and alarm systems are finished. The entire project is approximately 50 percent complete, according to Wyvalka.

In other business the directors approved appointment of Ms. Jeta Beem, R.N., as the school dietitian.

#### Bacteria detected in Lehman well water

Six months after contamination was found in Harveys Lake drinking water, some homeowners in Lehman Township appear to be facing the same problem. Bacteria contamination has been found in four townships, four homes in Lehman Center have detected bacterial contamination in their private drinking wells. Township officials are urging residents in that area to have their water tested.

Supervisor Douglas De Sauter is asking all Lehman Center residents to have their water tested. Sample bottles can be picked up by contacting the Lehman Center Health Department. The type of bacteria in the water has not yet been identified but the township is working to find the source.

The Kirby Health Center is asking anyone who has their water tested to have the results sent to them of the results. "We're trying to have the water tested as soon as possible," according to De Sauter. The township hopes they plan to discuss it with the health department.
