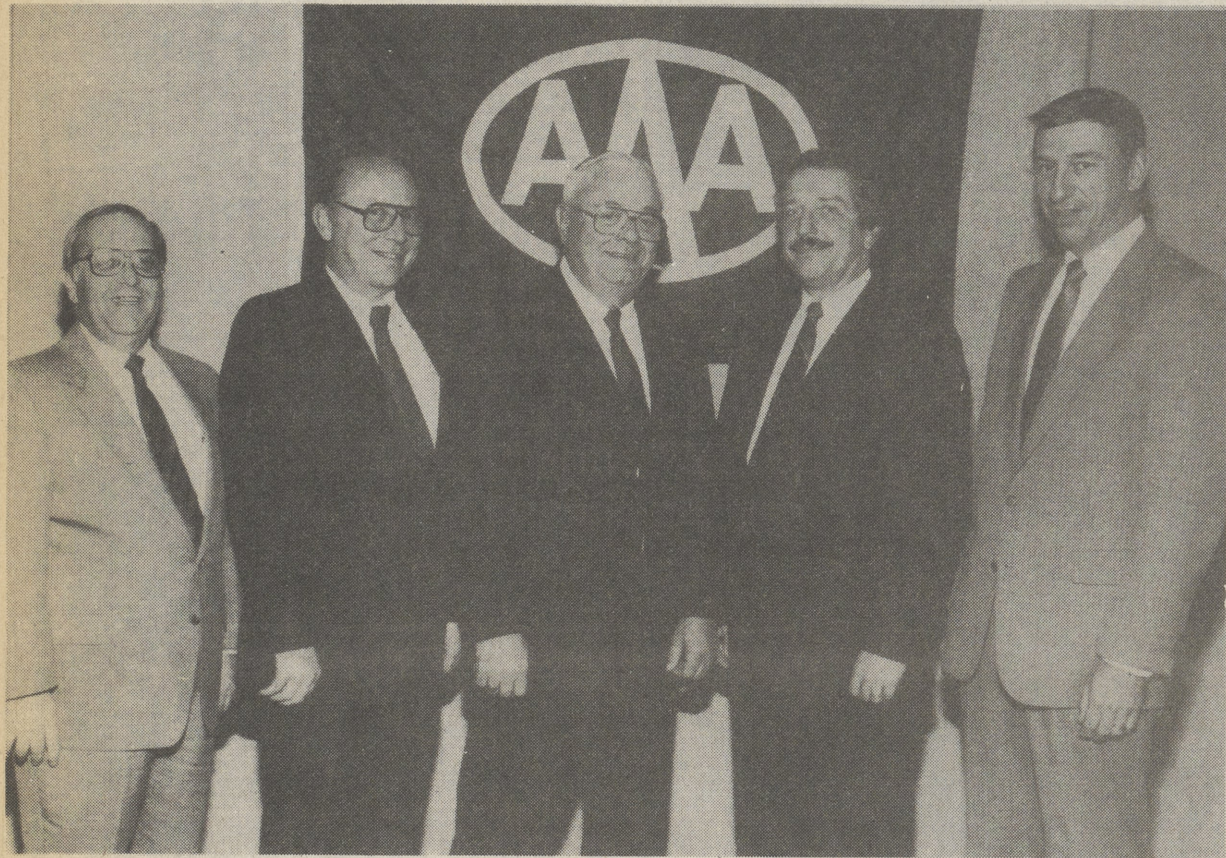
Program will honor Dr. King

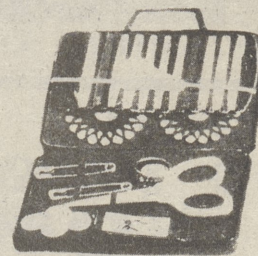
