- In the U.S. Government's classification of 20 major industries, printing and publishing ranks first in the number of business establishments, with more than 53,400 firms.
- In addition, the graphic communications industry includes an estimated 66,000 in-plant operations run by large companies and institutions such as schools and government agencies.
- Training for careers in graphic communications can be obtained through vocational-technical and college study and on-the-job apprenticeship.
- The International Association of Printing House Craftsmen, Inc.®
- Wages in graphic communications are above average for manufacturing industries.
- More Than 3/4 of all printing plants employ fewer than 20 people, making rapid advancement common.
- The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics estimates that the industry will need 62,000 new workers each year.
- Graphic communications businesses are located in every state and city and in most small towns.
