Zoning permits needed in Kingston Twp.

The residents or anyone locating in Kingston Township are reminded that the Township Zoning Ordinance requires that a Zoning Permit be issued for the following residential and non-residential activities:

The use of land, the use of buildings or the construction, enlargement, extension or modification of all buildings, accessory buildings, garages, decks, sheds, patios, fences, retaining walls, swimming pools, off street parking facilities, driveways or other openings onto a public street and porches, chimneys and all other projections into yard space. Also, the demolition of a structure and a home occupation require permits.

In addition a Building Permit is required for all new construction, including accessory buildings and enlargement, extension or exterior modification of existing buildings.

Permits or additional information may be obtained from the Zoning Officer, in the Municipal Office at 11 Carverton Road, Trucksville, Pa., daily from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.



Gavigan and Franklin sworn in

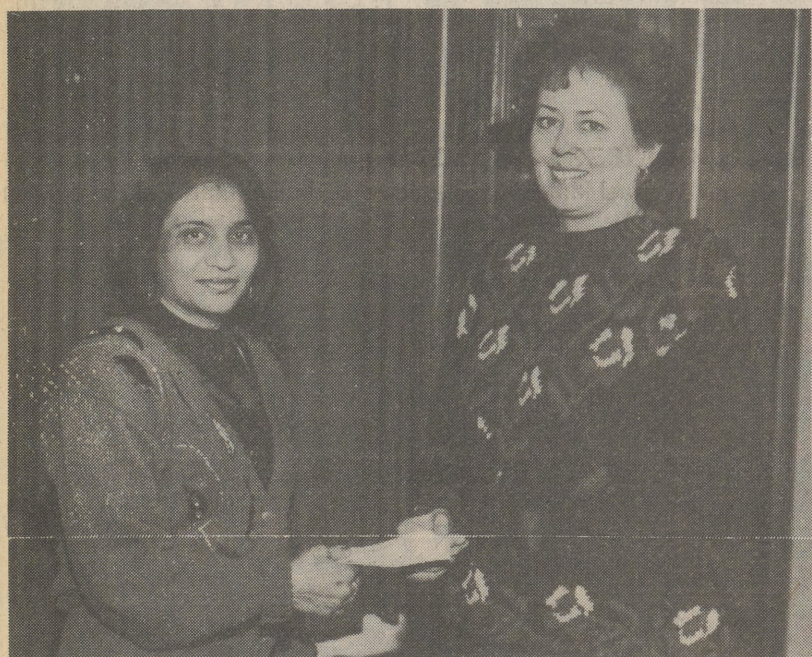
