"The general plan is to have a good time while helping a wonderful group of children counting on our support," Mosca said.

Rebekah Brighthaupt wins recipe contest

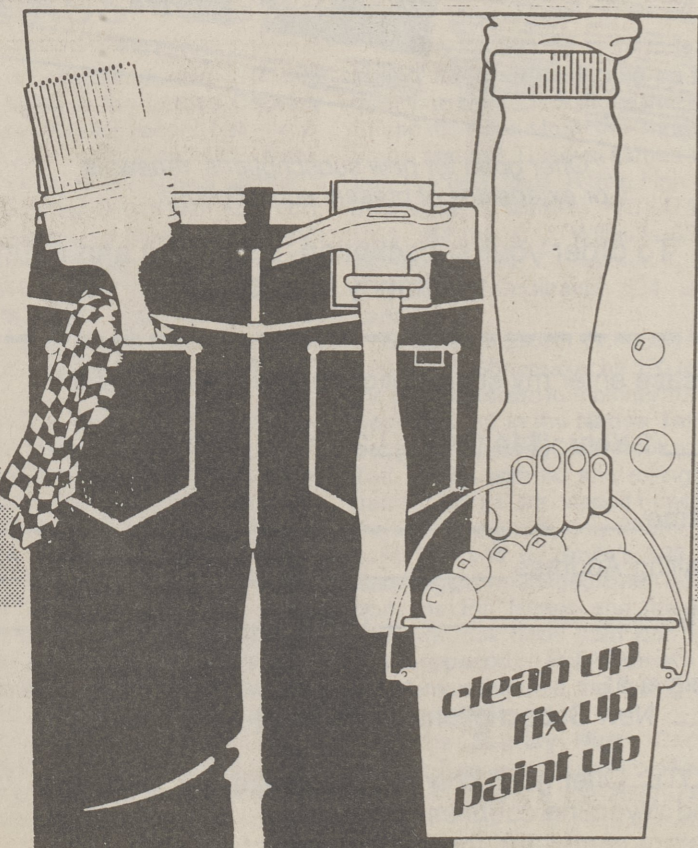

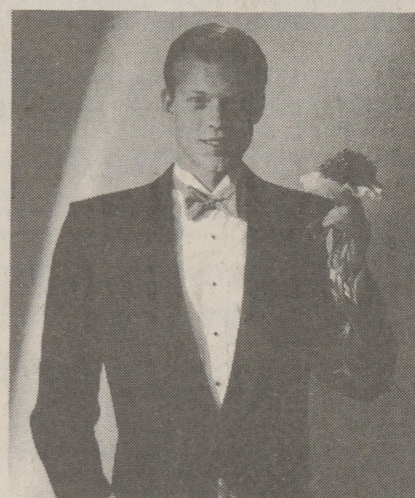
