Going in to Monday's game with Wyoming Valley West, the team was 7-0 and ranked 20 in the state and 10 in the East in the Pennsylvania Volleyball Coaches Association Poll. The Knights are the only local team in the rankings.

John is planning to attend college and has been accepted at East Stroudsburg and at Lock Haven.

"I have visited both and now it is up to me to decide which one to attend. If I go to East Stroudsburg I will play volleyball, if to Lock Haven I will play football," John said.

Parade forms at Fish Commission at Sandy Beach at 9:30 a.m. and begins promptly at 10 a.m.

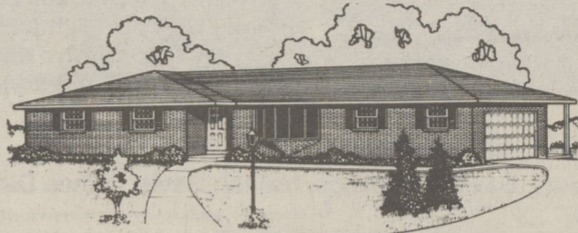

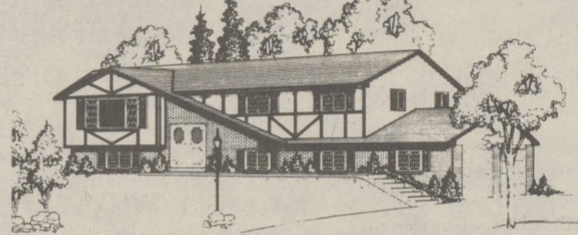
