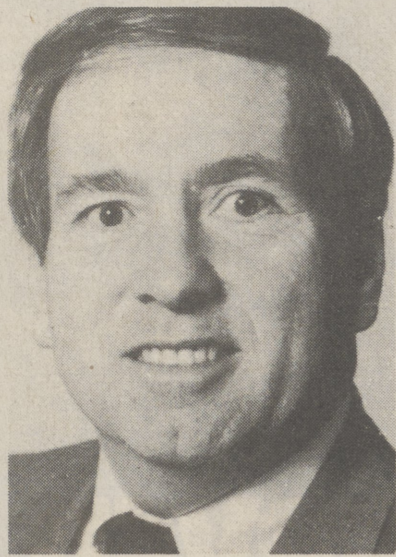

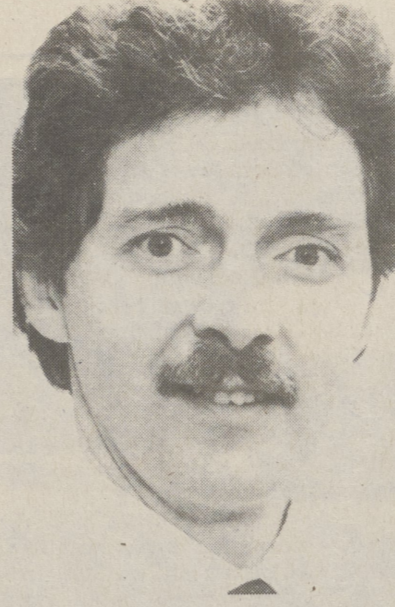

Pearman named acting CEO at Penn State

William A. Pearman, Ph.D., has been named acting Campus Executive Officer at Penn State Wilkes-Barre, effective July 1, according to an announcement today by Dr. Richard Grubb, senior vice president and dean of the Commonwealth Educational System of the Pennsylvania State University. Dr. Pearman will replace James H. Ryan, Ph.D., who has accepted an appointment as vice president of Continuing Education for the Penn State system.

Dr. Pearman has served as director of Academic Affairs at the campus since August of 1989. He previously served as provost and vice president of the academic affairs at Sacred Heart University in Fairfield, Connecticut.

Dr. Grubb also announced that the position of acting Director of Academic Affairs will be filled by Steven D. Putzel, Ph.D., assistant professor of English. Dr. Grubb added that a search committee will be established and a national search will be conducted for a permanent replacement for the CEO's post.

Dr. Pearman completed his undergraduate studies at La Salle

University in 1962, and received a master's degree in sociology/anthropology at Fordham University in 1964, and a doctorate in sociology from the University of Pittsburgh in 1966.

Dr. Pearman lives in Dallas, has been recognized for teaching excellence by the Danforth Foundation and received the first Pennsylvania Sociological Society Award for Research Excellence.

Dr. Putzel has held the post of assistant professor of English at Penn State Wilkes-Barre since 1988, and was named head of the English program in 1989.

He earned his Ph.D. from the University of Toronto in 1980 and was awarded several research grants and fellowships.

An expert in modern British and Irish literature, modern drama, folklore and mythology, Dr. Putzel most recently published an article in the prestigious "Journal of Dramatic Theory & Criticism" on Sam Shepard, playwright, rock musician and popular cult figure.

Dr. Putzel is married to Suzanne Westfall who is an assistant professor of English and theater at Lafayette College.

Campbell speaks before quadregional conference

James F. Campbell, director of Continuing Education for Penn State Wilkes-Barre, was a featured presenter at the Association for Continuing Higher Education Quadregional Conference in Bethlehem on April 23.

Campbell discussed the field of continuing education and the responsibility of educators to provide leadership development opportunities. He reflected on his recent participation in Harvard University's Management of Lifelong Education (MLE) program, an intensive program for senior administrators concerned with the design and implementation of lifelong learning programs.

In addition to his duties as director of Continuing Education at Penn State Wilkes-Barre, Campbell is Penn State's regional director for Continuing Education in the north-

east section of the state, which involves the overall coordination and supervision of continuing education programs and personnel in an 11 county area serviced by the Hazleton, Worthington-Scranton, Schuylkill and Wilkes-Barre campuses of Penn State, enrollment in the Penn State system.

Campbell holds a bachelor's degree from Penn State and a master's degree in education from Temple University.

He is a member of the National University Continuing Education Association, which recently named him a Distinguished mentor; and the Tri-County Personnel Association. He is a member of the board of directors of Leadership Wilkes-Barre and Step-by-Step, Inc.

He and his wife Ellen, and their three children, Matthew, Barbara and Robby live in Huntsville.

Outreach nursing program achieves rehab honors
