### Schoen is dean of business school

Dr. Donald Farmer, vice president and dean for academic affairs at King's College, recently announced the selection of the first deans who will head the College of Arts and Sciences and the William G. McGowan School of Business at King's.

Dr. William Shergalis, vice president for academic affairs at Ohio Dominican College, will serve as the dean for the College of Arts and Sciences, and Dr. Edward Schoen, professor and chairman of business administration at King's, has been named dean of the William G. McGowan School of Business. Both will begin their new duties in July.

Dr. Schoen, Dallas, has been a member of King's faculty since 1972. He has served as chairman of King's business administration major for 10 years, and served for two years as chairman of the business division, which includes eight majors.

"I happily accept the challenge of guiding the continued growth in quality and strength of King's business programs, and I anticipate a busy but rewarding agenda," said Dr. Schoen.

He has also served as an attorney at several law offices, and currently serves as Counsel to the Court in the Luzerne County Court of Common Pleas.

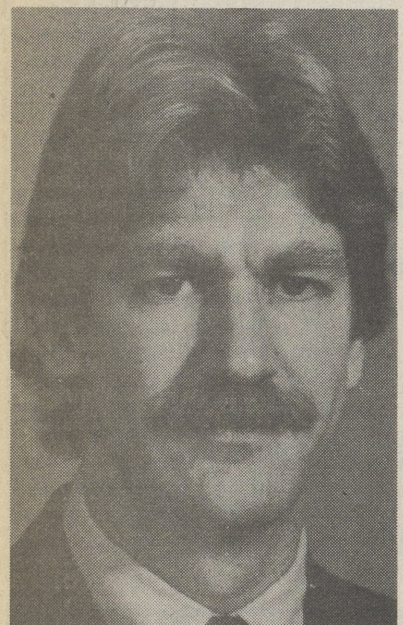

### Morgan gives smoking presentation in Chicago

The program, "Worksite Smoking Cessation Clinics, Policies, and Promotion", was presented at the 11th Annual Meeting of the Society of Behavioral Medicine. Participants were instructed in strategies for developing and implementing health promotion at the workplace.
