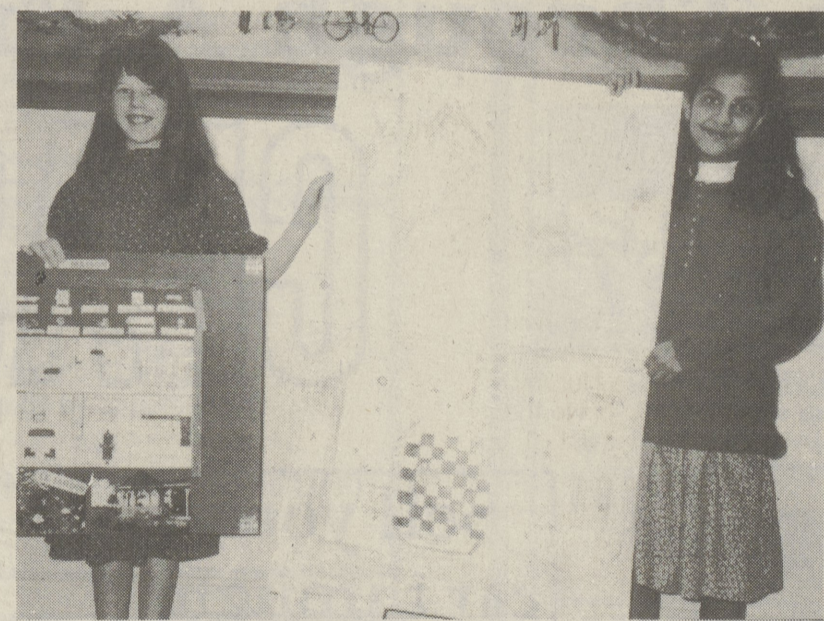
Penn State holds honors reception


