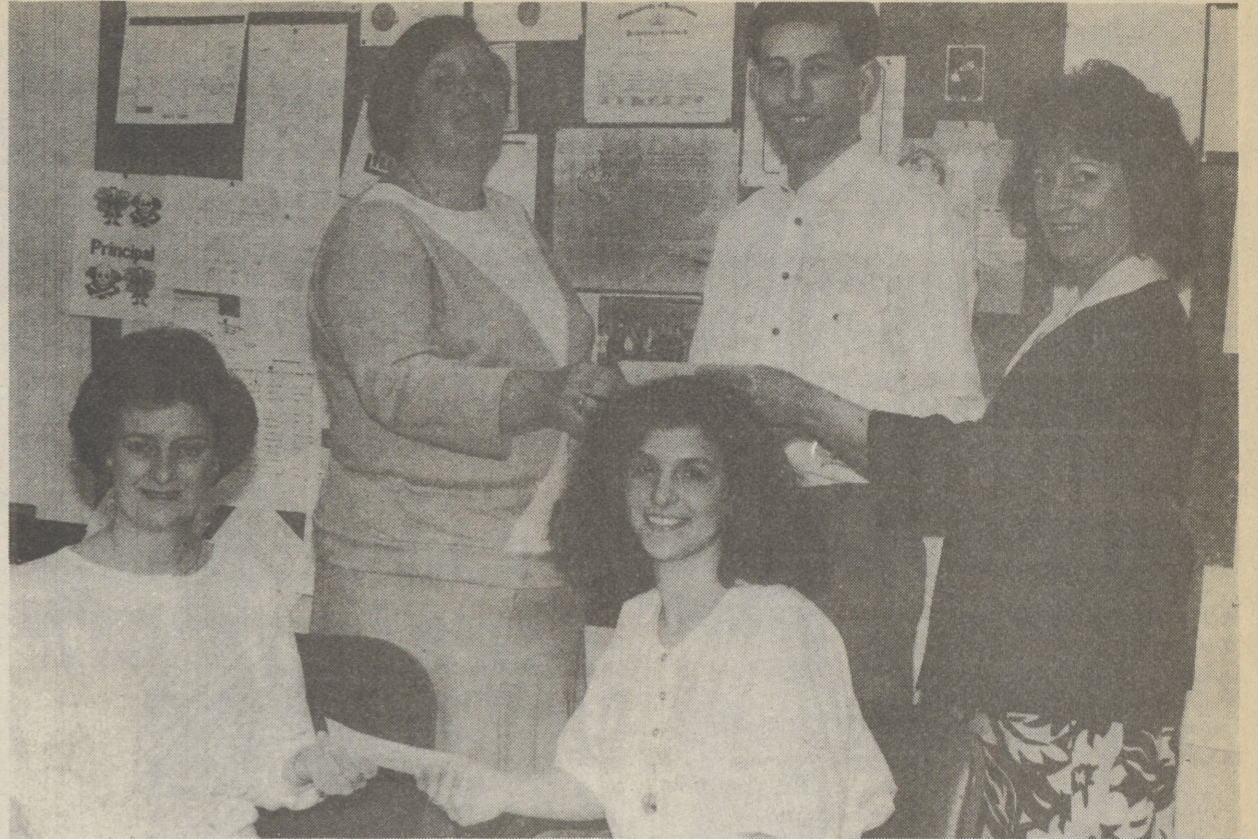

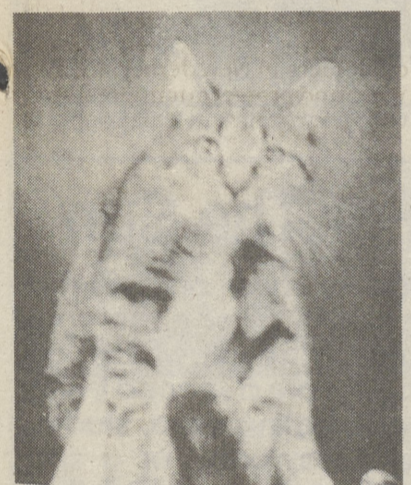

"911 is not only easy for the kids to dial, but in the enhanced system, when the number is dialed, a computer immediately puts up the location, service needed and an automatic call-back feature. The phone bill rate would be determined by the county," Miers ex-

plained. Miers also told the supervisors the enhanced system will have a contingency plan and if there is a power problem a generator will take over.

"Under the regular 911, we will be able to service 674, 675, 696, 639 and 477 numbers," Miers said.
