LCCC cites students from area

Approximately 728 students have earned recognition for outstanding academic achievement during the 1990 Spring semester at Luzerne County Community College.

In making the announcement, Thomas P. Leary, dean of admissions and student services at LCCC, noted that 110 students attained the distinction of being listed on the President's Honor Roll. To qualify, a student must earn a perfect 4.0 cumulative grade point average.

Three hundred and fifty-nine students attained a grade point average between 3.5 and 3.99 for placement on the Dean's List, and 259 were listed on the Honor Roll with an average between 3.25 and 3.49.

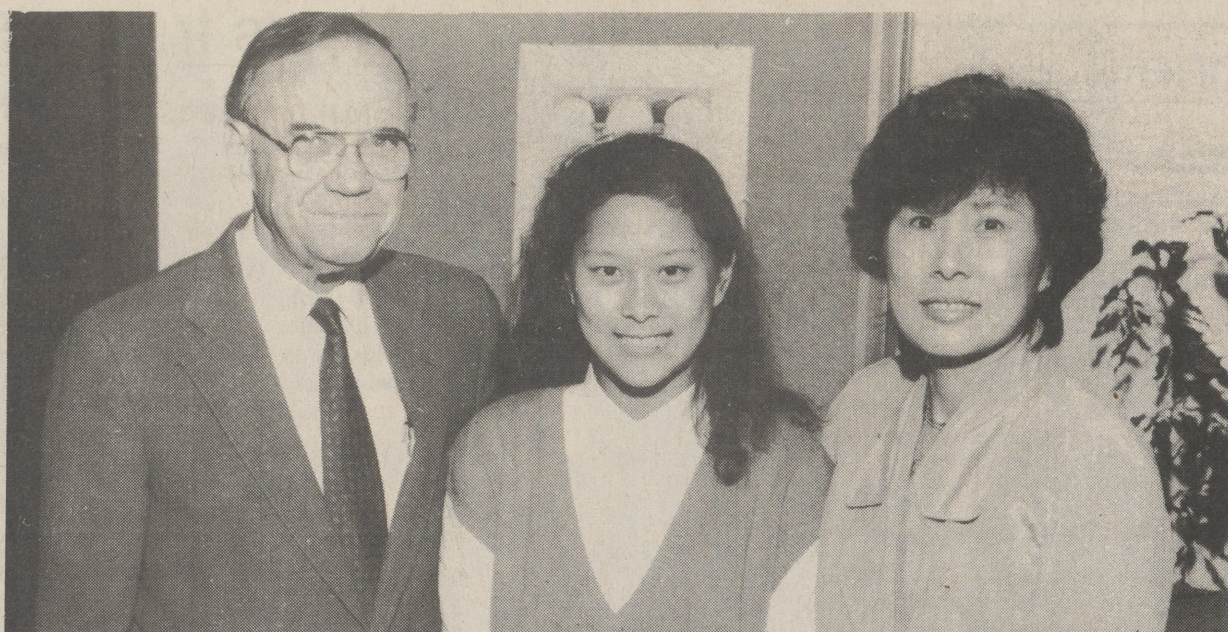
