## Nine graduates honored by Harveys Lake Women's Club

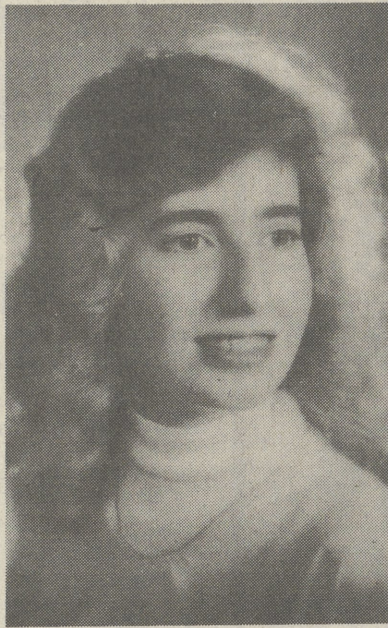

Nicole Gardner is the daughter of Robert and Priscilla Gardner of

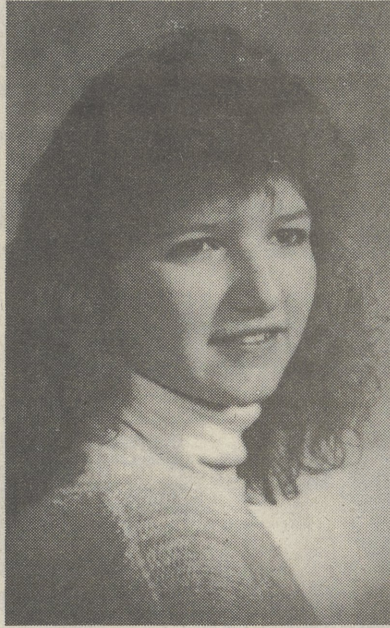

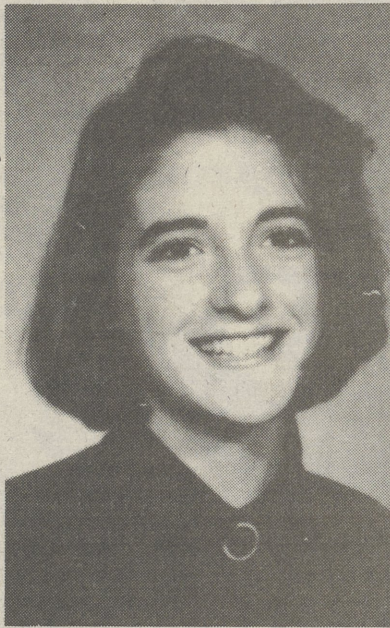

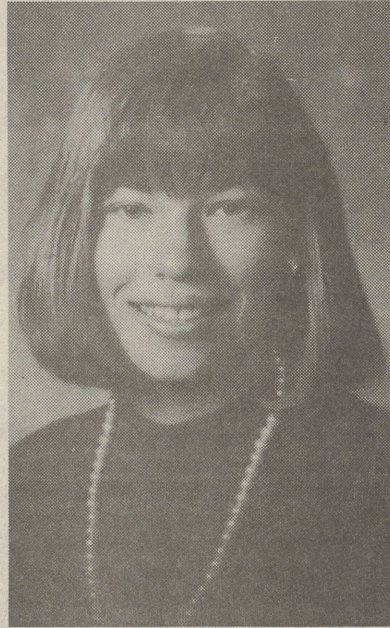

Kim Vollrath is the daughter of

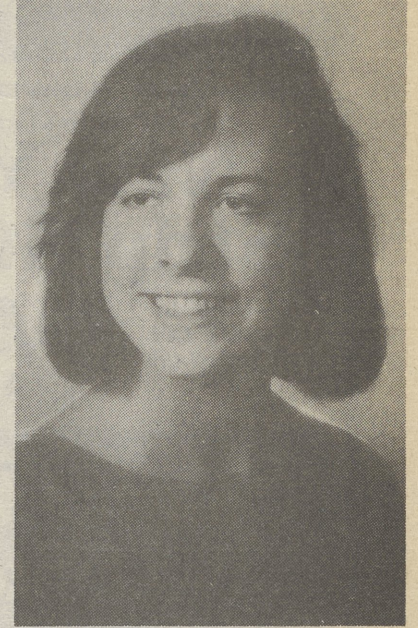

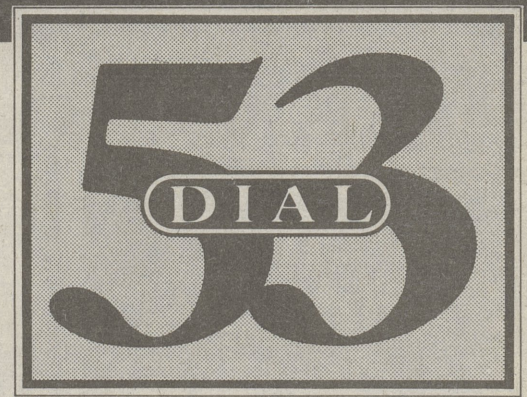
