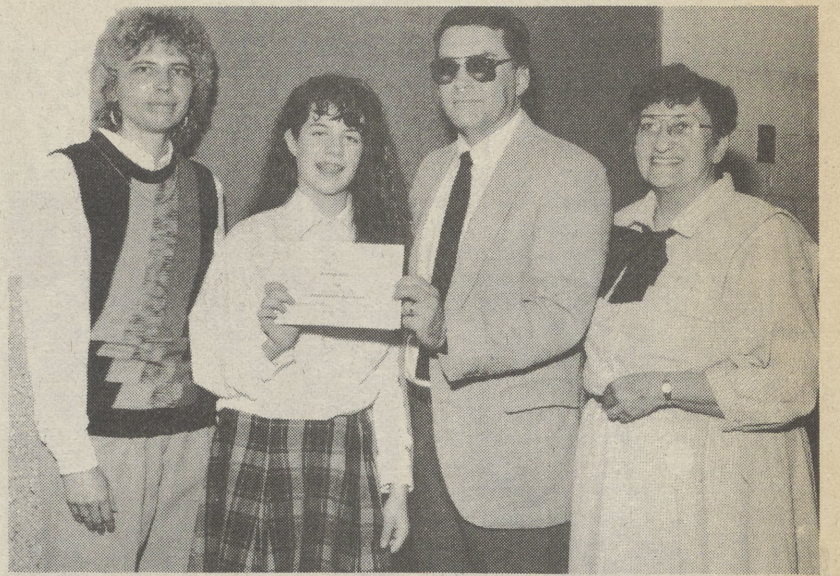

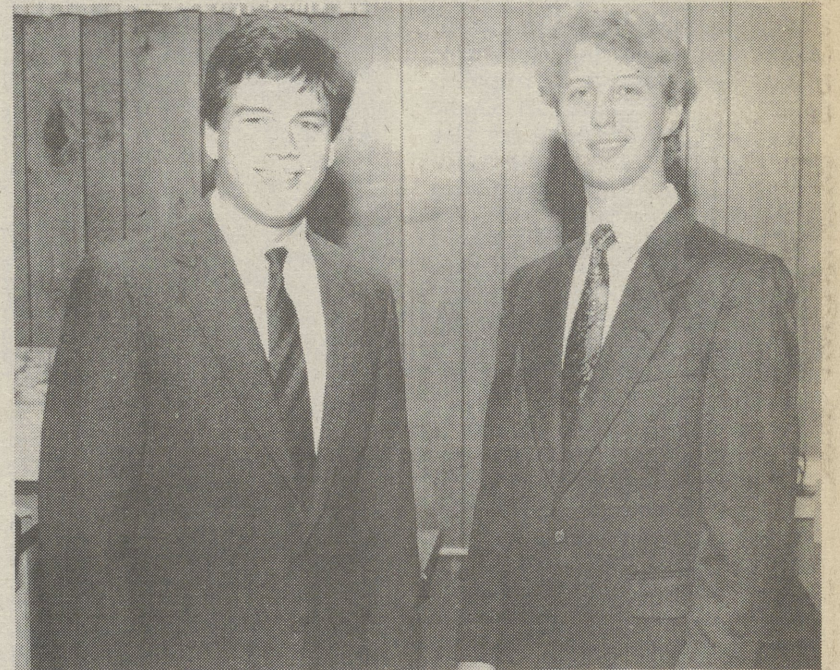
Loryn Mazur wins art award
