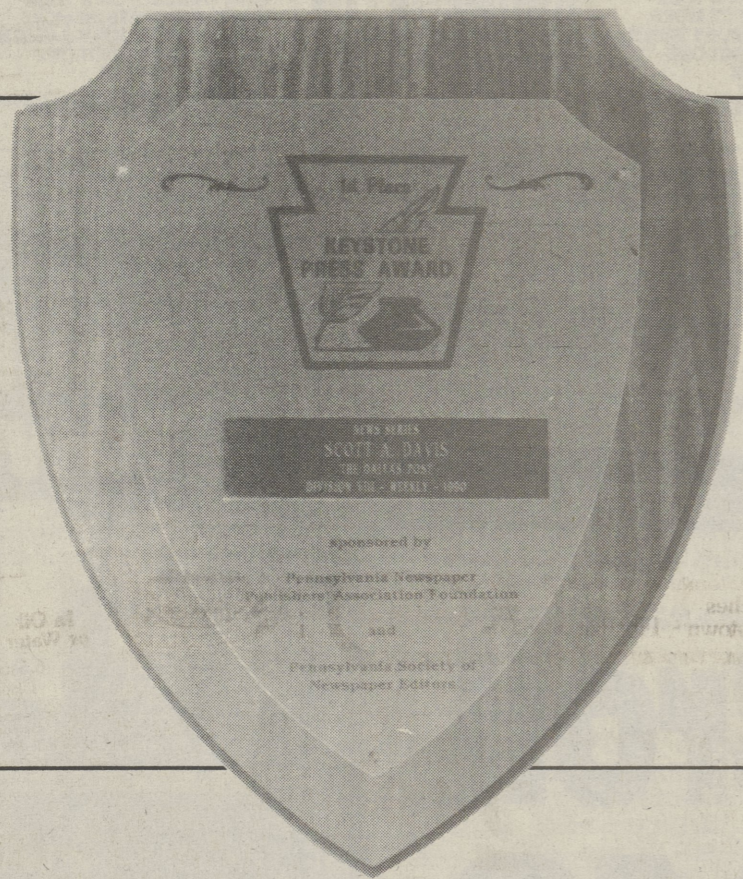

FIRST PLACE - NEWS SERIES

JUDGE'S COMMENTS: "This series stands out not only for the quality of its writing but also for its faithfulness to objectivity and presenting all viewpoints, standards not always met as well by newspapers considerably larger than The Post."



SECOND PLACE - EDITORIAL

Ronald Bartizek; "Traffic lights should be placed where the need is greatest"
