Sports Car Club to hold Solo II Autocross at Dallas July 15

On Sunday, July 15 the Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) represented by the Northeast Pa. Region (NEPA) will hold a Solo II Autocross at the Dallas Senior High School parking lot.

Technical inspection and sign up will begin at 9 a.m. with the first car scheduled to run at 11:30 a.m. The event is open to the public which is invited to view the event at no charge or to participate in it for a fee of \$11.00 per car.

A Solo II Autocross is an event held in a parking lot that has had a course set up in it. The course, around turns and thru slalom sections, generally takes about one minute to complete. The cars are

divided into classes based on car type and are scored by class.

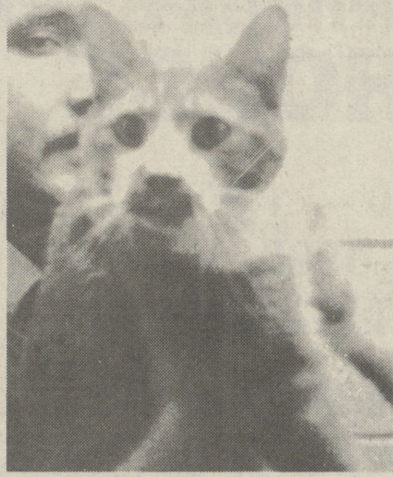
The SCCA stresses safety and car control at events like this and encourages the public to attend and even participate.

Participants must be 18 years or older and possess a valid drivers license. You need not be a member of SCCA to participate. Participants' cars must pass a technical inspection and instruction will be provided to those who have not been involved in a Solo II.

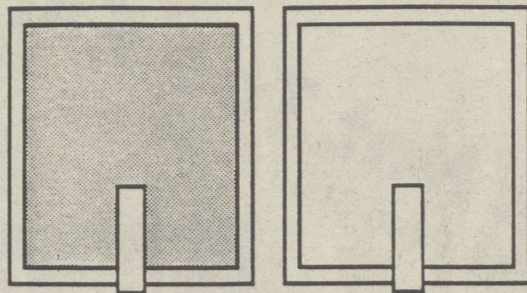
The SCCA has also scheduled Solo II Autocross events as follows: August 5, Luzerne County Community College; August 19, Dallas Senior High School.

Chapel Lawn vandalized fourth time in three months

For the fourth time in three months Chapel Lawn Memorial Park in Dallas has been vandalized. The latest incident took place sometime between the hours of 3 p.m. Sunday and Monday morning. The four attacks have caused a total of \$35 to \$40,000 damage, said Beverly Yarashus, the park's secretary Tuesday morning.

When employees came to work Monday morning they discovered that the vandals had broken the niche plate of mausoleum, taken the keys to the back hose, and used orange, gold, silver and brown paint owned by Chapel Lawn to spray profane graffiti over the front of the office and on a storage shed. They also painted a five-star Pentagram on the shed and broke two large

1500 watt quartz light fixtures. "Each time the vandalism has been worse," said Yarashus. "The first time they broke two niches, then 10 and then 20. They also broke a window. We had a security guard, but after a time the situation appeared to be resolved so we dismissed him. Now we have hired security again," she said.

This time the vandals also painted a large sign in the back of the shed calling us profane names. Dallas Township police are investigating the vandalism and Yarashus said the criminals will be prosecuted if apprehended. Police Chief Carl Miers said they have some names that were painted on the building to go by in their investigation. If caught, the criminals will be charged with criminal mischief which is a felony of the

third degree. If the loss exceeds \$5,000 the charge carries a maximum fine of \$15,000 and a maximum imprisonment of seven months.

The charge could also include vandalism, a felony, and desecration of a grave, a misdemeanor. The vandals also painted a sign on the shed with a \$5,000 fine and a two-year sentence up to two years in prison. "This last time the vandals spray painted two of the vehicles and the damage was so bad that the cry room was empty. It was the park's hours at sunset. We are property and any trespassing."

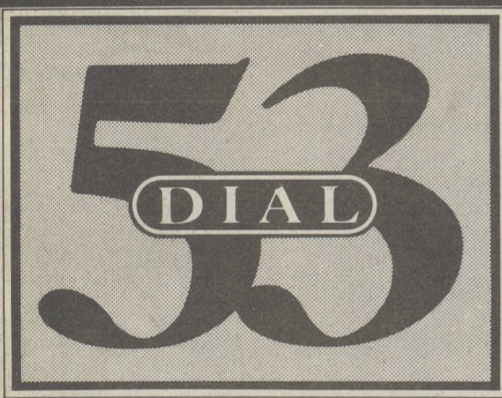
