## Accident victim's mother thanks rescuer

Jennifer Williams, 11 year-old daughter of Mrs. Arline Williams, Harding area, was critically injured, June 30, when the car in which she was a passenger driven by Stephen Williams of Pittston, ran off the south side of Lower Demunds Road and struck a bridge, then coming to rest after spinning around, in the middle of the roadway.

Williams told Officer Elliot Ide he was talking with his niece and not paying attention when he ran

off the road.

Officer Ide was assisted by Dallas Borough Police Department, Dallas Ambulance, Medic-One, Kingston Township Police and Rescue Unit, Kunkle Ambulance and Geisinger Life Flight who airlifted the injured girl to Geisinger Medical Center in Danville where she will be hospitalized for at least two months.

Mrs. Williams extended her sincere appreciation to Fred Rosencrans, Lower Demunds Road,

Dallas, who saved her daughter's life by applying pressure to a severed artery in the child's arm stopping the bleeding.

"The police said Jennifer would have bled to death if Rosencrans had not been at the scene," Mrs. Williams said. "He will probably be nominated for the Carnegie Award."

Stephen Williams was charged with driving under the influence and driving with his license suspended.


