## Lake-Lehman girls meet LaSalle coach

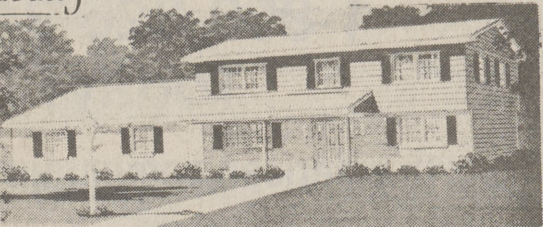

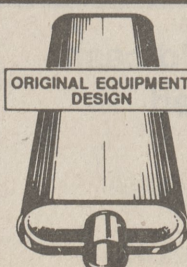
