That is not the only carriage in which a politician rode. One of Taylor's more notable carriages is an open stage in which Theodore Roosevelt rode around the St. Louis Exposition in 1904.

The sleighs and carriages all had little devices that made them special. Like a table, one sleigh could be made longer just by added a leaf. When completely assembled the sleigh would be 26 feet long.

There are many others that look as though they only have one seat. However upon closer examination Taylor will show you that a seat can be moved backwards and another seat will pop up, making it a two-seater.

Maybe the one carriage that had the most little "perks" was the road coach. Taylor likes to compare this to the motorhomes of today. The coach, which could seat 18 pas-






