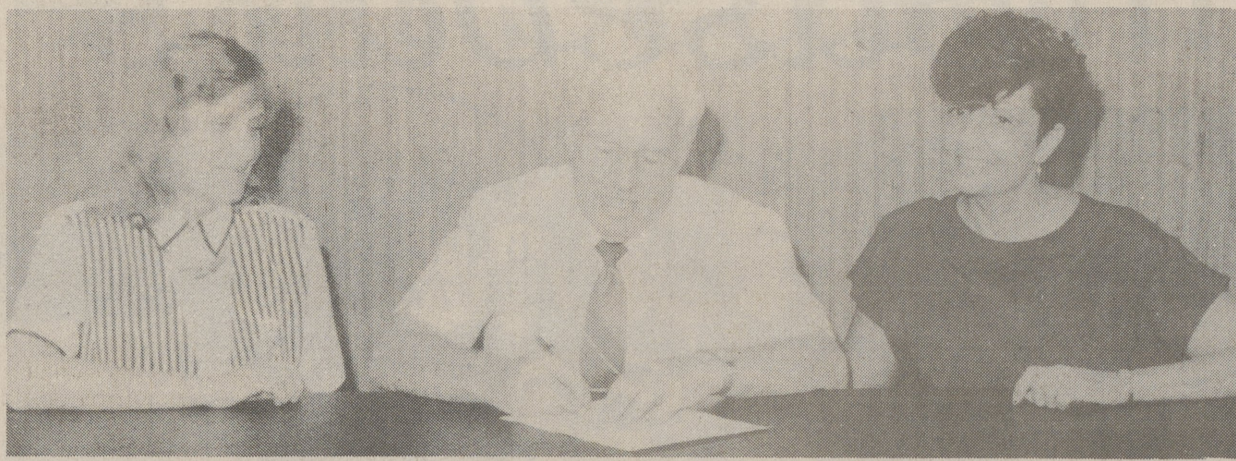

Dallas Women's Club tackles literacy

The Dallas Area Federated Women's Club is joining the United Nations and the Pennsylvania Federation of Women's Clubs in adopting literacy as the President's project for the 1990-91 administration. The goal will be to promote literacy awareness in the Dallas area and surrounding communities and to intensify efforts to spread literacy and education.

According to recent studies, one adult in five is functionally illiterate and unable to read a job application, street sign, or poison warning and less than one-half of high school seniors read at adequate levels to carry out moderately complex tasks.

Literacy affects everyone through lost money in businesses, increased government welfare rolls, overcrowded prisons, and limited

educational growth to children of low-literate parents.

The Education Department of the Club plans to present programs to its members and to work with people in the community to spread literacy and education.

Jean Hillard is President of the Dallas Area Federated Women's Club. Theresa Thompson is Education Chairman.

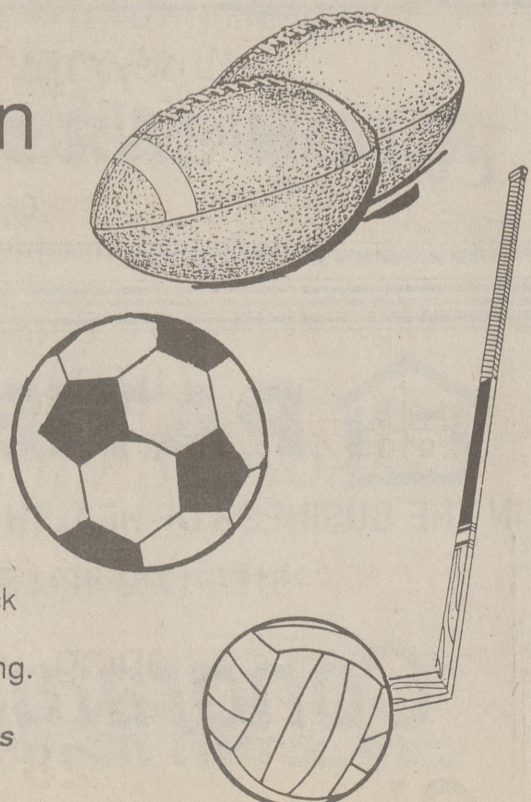
