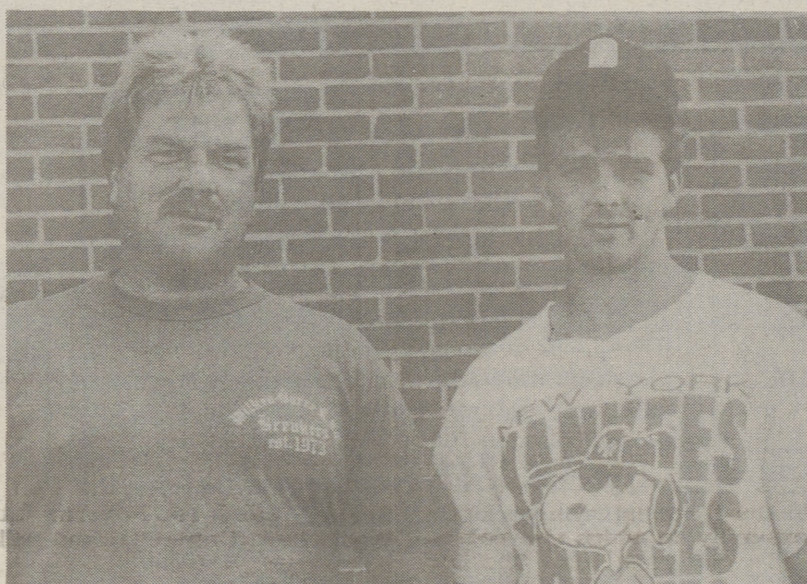


### Eighth annual Dallas Rotary Fall Classic set for Sept. 17

## Jackson gets two new assistants at Dallas

Two new assistant coaches are working with the Dallas High School football team this season due to the resignation of former assistant Paul Brown. Brown gave up his football job in order to concentrate fully on the high school basketball team, of which he is head coach.

Brown was appointed to that position at the July meeting of the school board following the resignation by former varsity basketball coach Clarence Ozgo.

Scott Francis of Shavertown and Harry Gulich of Dallas, are now working with head coach Ted Jackson, and assistants William Silvi and Tony Chiarucci. Francis, a 1987 graduate of Dallas High, is a senior at College Misericordia. While at Dallas, he was an outstanding baseball pitcher and quarterback for the varsity football team. Following graduation, he entered Johns Hopkins where he played as a defensive back on the varsity during his freshman year.

He transferred to Wilkes in his sophomore year but enrolled in College Misericordia in his junior year.

Francis was appointed as Dallas Junior High coach but this year has been assigned to working with the varsity offensive and defensive backs and receivers.

"I like coaching," Francis said. "The kids are great and eager to

learn. I also enjoy scouting the other teams, which all of us take turns doing."

Gulich, a native of Edwardsville, played as guard on the Edwardsville High School team. He attended Keystone Junior College and has been a Dallas resident since 1977.

"I have always liked football and I am still involved in flag football, playing whenever I have the opportunity," Gulich said. "I also played Rugby starting in 1974 and playing until 1976." Gulich is employed by the Dallas School District full-

time. Until this year, Gulich served as an assistant coach at the junior high but was moved up this season to the senior high, where he works with the linebackers and defensive ends.

"These are great kids," said Gulich. "I can't say anything but good about them. They are dedicated and work hard to improve themselves."

Gulich and his wife, the former Judith Peplowski, have two daughters, one a senior at Dallas, the other in seventh grade.

Pitching duties for the 1990 Minutemen will be shared by Keith

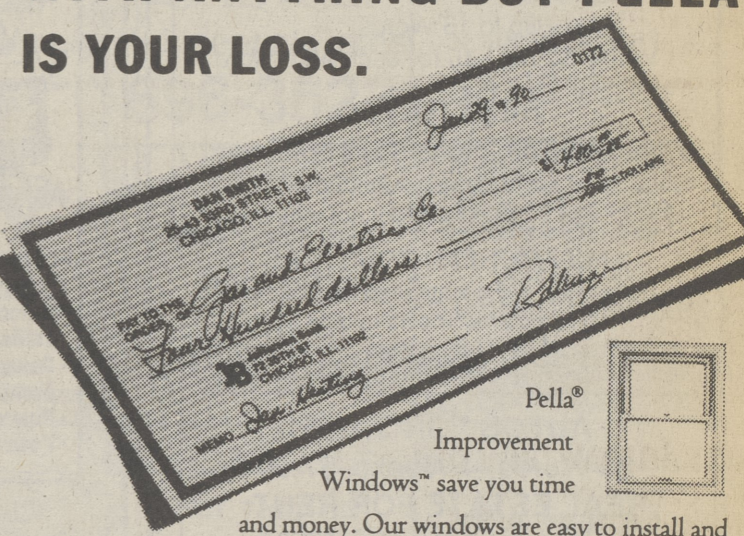
Schultz, and Bob Ashworth of Shavertown, and others. Ashworth will also handle the squad's catching duties.
